

LOCAL BUSINESS HAS IMPROVED

Especially Along Those Lines Dependent Upon Cold Weather.

UNEVENTFUL IN BANKING.

Remarkable Increase in Clearings Has Been Largely Due to the Payment of Taxes.

The local business situation has greatly improved this week, especially along those lines more or less dependent upon the advent of cold weather. In banking, the week has been uneventful beyond a remarkable increase in the clearings due to payment of the taxes, and heavy beet sugar transactions, as well as to a natural increase in business. Rates have remained about the same, and there is not much local call for borrowings. A confidential Wall street letter states that "The elections passed off without affecting prices greatly. Many see in the election results, a promise on the part of the administration to curb the trusts, and to introduce more government control in their affairs. That this view is partly justified, is seen by the fact that the department of justice at Washington is about to sue against the Standard Oil company with a view to dissolving it into each of the 75 or 80 constituent companies a proportionate share of the stock. It remains to be seen what success the government in this direction will have. A liquidation of the trust would be a relief to the money market by the fact that the New York associated banks show a deficit in their reserve of over one and a half millions, combined with the statement of the secretary of the treasury that no further relief need be expected unless business conditions make such action imperative. It is expected, however, that the high rates for money will draw funds to New York, and thereby relieve the strain."

THE REALTY MARKET.

There has been little of moment the past week in the realty market, although dealers report a continued demand for houses, particularly houses of four to eight rooms, so it is evident that there will be abundant opportunity for a large and amplified continuation next spring of the house building renaissance. The advent of cold weather has put a question on the minds of many who are out of doors, and the weather is doing nothing to help them. There is a disposition to buy up acreage as well as other classes of realty for investment, that is, to let it lie and then sell on a rising market; while the purchasers buy tracts and cut up into lots. The latter is the more common method.

The brick men report their ability to catch up on all past orders in the winter, as the demand from the summer has largely ceased, and the local brick company is turning out 25,000 ordinary brick per day, and 10,000 extra quality brick per day. The elimination of the brick quarries from the local market, is being offset by the opening of quarries in adjoining regions, not under government control. Parley's canyon has some excellent stone, and the railroad being adjacent, the stone can be brought in without trouble or delay.

HARDWARE TRADE.

The hardware people report everything in their line moving except poultry and summer drier screens. The trade is not in getting orders, but how to fill them, for the old, chronic trouble of getting orders filled from eastern factories continues with no signs of abatement. There is a stronger demand than ever for mining machinery and supplies, noticeably in the direction of Nevada, and Elly in particular is calling heavily on Salt Lake for goods. The Salt Lake Hardware company has arranged with the railroad to haul a car daily from this city for all classes of goods so that shipment is quick and direct, and nothing is neglected. The demand for general repairs is strong, and the call for roller skates continues with no indications of abatement for some time to come. However, the trade reports that "collections are not very good, considering the amount of business done."

NEW LUMBER PRICES.

The lumber trade reports the receipt of the new price list which makes a horizontal rise of \$2 per 1,000 feet on rough fir, common fir, etc., and \$1 per 1,000 feet on red woods and stock patterns. Then the western shingle mills are advancing their prices at the rate of five cents per 1,000 each week, and on Dec. 15, all the shingle mills will

GOOD TRADE IN HOLIDAY GOODS

It Has Begun to Move Early and In a Volume Promising Satisfactory Results.

WHOLESALE BUSINESS IS O. K.

Metal Market Marked by Narrow Fluctuations—Diminished Receipts Give Support to Wheat.

New York, Nov. 23.—R. G. Dun & Co.'s Weekly Review of Trade Conditions for November says: Weather conditions have retarded trade in seasonal staple lines of merchandise, but holiday goods have begun to move unusually early and in a volume that promises satisfactory results. Wholesale business is maintaining a much better movement than last year, and further improvement is noted in collections. Activity in the hide market is fully maintained, most western packers being fully sold up to current selling.

Narrow fluctuations have characterized the metal market. Diminished receipts at the northwest gave support to wheat, total arrivals with primary markets since July 1 now showing a material loss from last year's movement, but smaller foreign buying and less activity of flour mills offset the sustaining factors.

Liabilities of commercial failures thus far reported for November amounted to \$4,111,944, of which \$1,801,487 were in manufacturing, \$2,267,009 in trading and \$103,251 in other commercial lines.

BUSINESS NOTES.

"Little doing," is the almost universal report among brokers engaged in the buying and selling of local stocks. Public attention is being drawn to the fact that the many mining enterprises being promoted and only occasional transactions in the commercial dividend payers are noted. Brokers expect a demand for gold and silver to be the holiday dividend period approach. Reports from all the sugar factories indicate that operations are going forward smoothly and that the largest crop of sugar in the history of Utah and Idaho is being rapidly turned into refined sugar. The price of sugar continues low, a considerable weakening having taken place of late, due to the warfare between rival companies on the coast.

The feature of the week was the payment of the 5 per cent special dividend by the Deseret National bank, making a total of 17 per cent for the year.

GERMAN INS. CO'S.

Berlin, Nov. 23.—Dr. Rosenstock, a representative of some of the San Francisco claimants, has had an interview with the president of the Imperial Insurance inspection bureau on the subject of the refusal of the various German insurance companies to pay their losses. The president could only promise to mediate between the parties, being unable to interfere with the decision of the court. On the other hand, the difficulties in the case is that the period under the German law in which such claims can be recovered expires April 18, 1907, but it is absolutely impossible to serve the law claims within the time limit.
