The wholesale dry goods trade is lo-The wholesale dry goods trade is lo-cally very active with the advent of cold weather, and there is a strong and increasing demand for quilts, blankets, flannels of all kinds, fleeces, and heav-s ler textiles. The demand for horse blankets far exceeds the supply, and jobbers are about cleaned out. Jobbers remort the demand furning toward stra jobbers are about cleaned out. Jobbers report the demand turning toward sta-ple fabrics, in quiet shades, and there are many lines of serges, plain Henri-ettas, poplins, and mohairs that are sold ahead for spring. The clearing up of heavy weight dress goods in the first hand market is progressing, with large orders from the western markets for manufacturers to consider. The wholesalers are now devoting most of their attention to the selection of styles for next spring, especially in the line of ready-made clothing. Jobbers also report that prices on all lines of bleached goods will not be any lower, as the garment trade of the country is

bleacted goods will not be any lower, as the garment trade of the country is short on goods. Fine dress ginghams are sold ahead as far as the mills will take orders. Print cloths are sciling a little lower. A famine is feared dur-ing the next two months in denims, tickings, drills, jeans and twills, and in wash fabrics the market percents were wash fabrics the market remains very strong. The market is reported as practically bare of leading lines in white goods, and for the fall of 1907 the shirt waist makers and jobbers will take averturable.

will take exceptionally large quantities of staple white goods. It is predicted that a large business will be done next that a large business will be done next year in silk piece goods, aithough silk has advanced 30 cents per pound this year, and manufacturers have notified all jobbers that advances must be paid on all reorders for the present season, and manufacturers cannot name prices on new lines. It is interesting to note that manufacturers of knit goods now positively refuse to sell to retailers, and each garment sold as a second will be marked such sold as a second will be marked such. A large business is being done along all kait goods lines, and there is also a heavy demand for linen piece goods.

RETAIL DRY GOODS.

RETAIL DRY GOODS. In the retail dry goods market, the advent of cold weather has proven al-ready a godsend. A prominent local house reports the business of the present 10 and 17 per cent ahead of that of last year. Cloaks and saits are go-ing well, as well as much stuff that has been laid aside during the long spell of pleasant weather. There is a steady-demand for all staple lines reported, including fancy needle work which is twice as good as last year. Orders are being sent east for further supples of being sent east for further supplies of separate skirts, in cheviots, tibets, fine worsteds in manulab effects and broadconstants. There is also a demand for the best materials in Princess and Employ gowns and for dressy, fur trimmed street costumes. There is also a sus-tained demand for all clauses of misses'

tailed demand for all claises of misses' wear in medium and high grades, this business developing on styles similar to those popular for adults. The great-est demand in outer garments for miss-es' wear is on the three-quarter length, loose fitting cloak. WHOLESALE GROCERY TRADE.

The wholesale grocery trade reports a general congestion of orders with pro-ducers and western and eastern shipducers and western and eastern ship-pers, which bodes no good to filling or-der's from this city with anything like facility, so that the local market is becoming shorter and shorter along certain lines of staple goods, as dried fruits, nuts, etc. When summer opened the unusually bountiful crops of prunes and kindred fruits was promised in the horthwest; but pres-ently tremendously heavy rains came which destroyed the crops to such an which destroyed the crops to such an extent as to leave an actual shortage, where a heavy surplussage was prom-

GOOD TRADE IN

It Has Begun to Move Early and In a Volume Promising Satisfactory Results.

WHOLESALE BUSINESS IS O. K.

Metal Market Marked by Narrow Fluctuations-Diminished Receipts Give Support to Wheat.

New York, Nov, 23 .- R. G. Dun & Co.'s Weekly Review of Trade tomorrow will say:

Weather conditions have retarded trade in seasonable stuple lines of merchandise, but holiday goods have begun to move unusually early and in a volume that promises satisfactory results. Wholesale business is maintaining a much better movement than last year, and further improvement is noted in collections. Activity in the hide market is fully maintained, most western packers being fully sold up to urrent salting.

Narrow fluctuations have characterized the metal market. Diminished re ceipts at the northwest gave suppor to wheat, total arrivals with primury markets since July 1 now showing a material loss from last year's move ment, but smaller foreign buying and less activity of flour mills offset the sustaining factors.

Liabilities of commercial failures thus far reported for November amounted to \$4,111,944, of which \$1,801,687 were in manufacturing, \$2,207,906 in trading and \$103.251 in other commercial lines,

BUSINESS NOTES.

"Little doing," is the almost uni-ersal report among brokers engaged a the buying and selling of local tooks. Public attention for the time eing seems to be divided to the many mining enterprises being promoted, and only occasional transactions in the commercial dividend payers are noted. Brokers expect to see a revival of in-terest as the holiday dividend periods approach. Reports from all the sugar factories indicate that operations are going forward smoothly and that the largest crop of beets in the history of Utah and Idaho is being rapidly turned into refined sugar. The price of sugar continues low, a considerable weakenng having taken place of late, due to he warfare between rival companies on the coast.
