She-Alack, sir knight, I yielde mee true captive to thy wordes, succour or noe succour. My ransome is thy dowrie riche. Hie thee from my bouerre to ye knight, my sire, and bid him greet the sonne. (She swounes inn the knight

And in like manner through the early Saxon and ancient British dialects (which would be more unintelligble than lovers speeches generally are) the Latin and Greek, up to the original Chinese, as aforesaid. The Irish version is:


