## LOCAL NEWS.

Newton's Benefit.—A complimentary benefit to the popular versatile artist, Mr. W. G. Newton, will be given at the Salt Lake Music Hall on Wednesday evening, February 6th. The performance will include the beautiful drama, "Ben Bolt," and a grand olio, in the latter of which the benefactor will render some of his specialties in songs, dances and instrumental pieces.

At the Music Hall.—This fast becoming popular resort was crowded last evening, the occasion being the presentation by the 21st Ward Dramatic Company of the sensational drama, "The Denouncer," followed by the farce, "Omnibus." The acting was spirited, facile and entertaining. Messrs. Scott, Burton and James being especially good. The scenery by Morris was very fine, and the music by Giles' Orchestra, very good indeed.

Supreme Court.—Proceedings in the Supreme Court of Utah on Wednesday afternoon, Jan. 30, 1884.

The case of F. Auerbach & al., respondents, vs. Robert Mulhall, appellant, on appeal from the district court, came up for a rehearing, pursuant to leave heretofore granted, and was argued by F. Hoffman, Esq., for appellant, and M. M. Kallen, Esq., for respondent. Submitted and taken under advisement.

The case of Beutler vs. Hampton came up for a rehearing, and was argued by Arthur Brown, Esq., for Beutler, the appellant, Thos. Marshall, Esq., appeared for respondent.

The Bar Association.—The articles of incorporation adopted yesterday by the committee of the Salt Lake Bar Association, provide that the purposes for which the corporation is formed are the procurement and maintenance of a law library and maintaining the honor and dignity of the profession of the law, for cultivating social relations among its members and increasing its usefulness in promoting the administration of justice. The principal place of business of the corporation shall be Salt Lake City and the term of its existence is fixed at fifty years.

The board of trustees consists of thirteen stockholders and the names of those who were appointed for the first year are as follows, to-wit: Thomas Marshall, Joseph B. Rosborough, Parley L. Williams, Jacob S. Boreman, Wm. H. Dickson, Benjamin Shanks, Charles K. Gilbert, James G. Buchanan, Robert N. Baskin, Wm. W. Woods, Moses Kirkpatrick, Enos D. Hoge and Arthur Brown. The first year was appointed to expire on the 1st of January, 1885. The president, Parley L. Williams, Treasurer, and Henry G. McMillan, Secretary.

The capital stock of the corporation is to be \$1,000, divided into 200 shares of the par value of 50 cents each.

# GRAND RABBIT HUNT.

HOW THE "SMOOTH-FACES" OF DRAPER LOST A SHOOTING MATCH, DANCE AND SUPPER.

A Draper correspondent sends in a lively account of a grand rabbit hunt and shooting match which took place there a few days since, between some of the married and unmarried young men of the settlement, ten on a side, the former of whom were dubbed for the occasion, "Smooth-Faces," and the latter "Smooth-Faces."

The agreement was that the twenty Nimrods, the best shots in the settlement, should go forth on a certain day among the long-earred denizens of the sage brush, and between the hours of 8 a. m. and 3 p. m., the side which slaughtered the greatest number of rabbits should receive free invitations to a party to be given at the expense of the other side. Eight judges were chosen to witness the proceedings and decide in all disputes according to the rules of the game.

The day set for the contest, having arrived, hunters and judges, in four spirited teams, struck out for the hills north of the eastern part of Draper, and all having aligned, and the signal being given to start, forward went the men with gun closely followed by the judges, and in a few minutes the work of destruction commenced. The sport was kept up with unabated vigor till noon, when the entire party halted at the D. & R. G. station to partake of a well earned lunch, and then, after an exhilarating exercise had amply prepared them.

It was here ascertained that the "Smooth-Faces" were leading the score by a considerable, but in order that the excitement and interest might not diminish, it was whispered about by the judges that the score stood 25 to 25.

Again the two parties sallied forth and the hunt continued with unabated enthusiasm until 6 o'clock, the hour set to cease, by which time the circuit of the settlement had been made and the jaded sportsmen, with begrimed faces and smoking shot-guns, gathered at the spot from which they had started in the morning. The judges, after consulting a few moments, announced the score to be 25 to 25 in favor of the "Smooth-Faces."

This argument in favor of married life was a staggerer to the bachelor outfit, who, too proud to assign their defeat to real and evident cause, fell to blaming their innocent guns for it and the very next day sent a challenge to the Nimrods to shoot another rabbit match for the supper. The challenge was readily accepted and the most strenuous efforts were made by the "Smooth-Faces," whose noses were sadly "out of joint," to win the second victory.

The settlement was aroused by them in all directions for the best shot-guns that could be borrowed or obtained for love, money or jack-knives, and some of them even came to Salt Lake to hire guns for the occasion. But all to no purpose, again the Esau was victorious. The "Smooth-Faces" had struggled valiantly, one of them (who, it is understood, would be married if he could) raising his individual score to 23, while others of his clan went up into the teens. But at the final outcome the result stood 28 to 11, in favor of the "Smooth-Faces."

A generous "three cheers" for their opponents was given by the victorious ten, and on the following Saturday a splendid dance and party were given and partaken of, agreeable to the condition laid down in the beginning, free passes being extended to the winning side. It is bruited about that at the dance, every one of the losing ten proposed to his lamorastra and was accepted, and that from henceforth single men in Draper will be somewhat scarcer than heretofore.

## THE COUNTERFEIT CASE.

PROCEEDINGS AGAINST AUGUSTUS W. DEVORE.

The case of the People vs. Augustus W. Devore, who is charged with using the U. S. Mails for the purpose of fraud, came up this morning at 10 o'clock before Commissioner McKay. Mr. Denney, attorney for the defendant, moved that the case be dismissed on the grounds that there is no provision in the statutes which provides for the offense as stated in the complaint.

Mr. Snow, the prosecuting attorney, claiming special privilege to have existence, combated the motion vigorously, whereupon, his honor, continued the case until 1 o'clock, in order to have sufficient time to look over the statutes before rendering an opinion.

At the opening of the case at 1:30 o'clock, Mr. Denney claimed that as the defendant was arrested under the United States law, while the warrant was issued in the name of the People of the Territory, and there being no law for such a proceeding, he requested that the case be dismissed and the prisoner discharged.

The prosecuting attorney, Mr. Snow, held that as he would be prosecuted by the authority of the Territory, yet it would be a United States case, and that the alleged defect in the warrant did not vitiate it.

Commissioner McKay decided, without passing upon all the points brought forward by the attorneys, that he himself made a mistake in issuing the warrant, which ran in the name of the People of the Territory, instead of the People of the United States. He therefore ordered that the defendant be discharged, which was accordingly done.

The Commissioner expressed the opinion that the defendant could still be held if the Marshal cared to make out another complaint, but did not believe there was any case against the defendant, and it would eventuate sooner or later in his discharge. Some present seemed disposed to take issue with the Commissioner on his action, claiming that the case was not a United States case, as the matter of sovereignty was all that was at stake, and that the defendant was a citizen of the Territory.

Pleasant Valley Mines.—Superintendent Wm. G. Sharp returned a few days ago from Scotland, Pleasant Valley, Utah. The Utah Central mine is still burning, but not so extensively as before. Another attempt was made last week to put out the fire and recover the bodies of the McLeans, but it only resulted in taking out some of the burning material. Another effort will be made shortly. Mrs. McLean, widow of one of the miners, is feeling better and has moved down to Provo.

The Pugsley mine, about half a mile from the other claim, is now being worked, and coal shipping is going on at the rate of 100 tons per day. This mine was purchased by the Utah Central Company of Philip Pugsley, hence its name. It had not been worked to any extent before the purchase of the other mine, which has rendered its development necessary.
