MILLARD STATE CONFERENCE.

The Millard State Quarterly Conference was held at Fillmore City, the 24th and 25th of November, 1882, President Ira N. Hinckley presiding.

The following were in the presence of Apostle F. M. Lyman and Pres. A. H. Cannon of the Presidency of the Seventies. All the respective Bishops or their Counselors.

The reports of the spiritual and temporal condition of the Ward were good, harmony and good feeling existing among the workers in Priesthood, and an increase of all members and faithfulness among the members.

The following brethren addressed the Conference: Apostle F. M. Lyman, Presidents A. H. Cannon, Ira N. Hinckley, Daniel Thompson, W. V. Johnson, Bishops J. D. Smith, H. E. Bennet, A. Kimball, J. Black, L. N. Christianson, Thomas Yates, D. R. Stevens, Elders George

Besides the regular conference meetings, Brother Lyman (who arrived here on the evening of the 17th) addressed the congregation at their evening and gathering for practical and valuable instruction to brethren, in his usual plain and impressive manner.

The following day, the next day, and the two brethren (Lyman and Cannon) also attended and addressed the priesthood meeting held at the academy, which was held after Sunday morning's meeting, when the 21st and 4th Quorums of the Seventies were organized by filling vacancies in the quorums; and otherwise, all the improvements, Association Sunday evening, and again meeting with the Saints of Meadow Creek on the 20th at 10 a.m., and at Kanab, 7 p.m.

The main topics spoken on were family and church government, necessity of good examples by parents and the working priesthood, teaching their children the principles of the Gospel and the impropriety of Church members marrying outside sects.

The addresses of the speakers were fraught with the power of the Holy Spirit, and much freedom of expression.

On one occasion the teachings of the Lord were so manifestly true to those who ministered the world, and marked spirit of progression was manifested. The local authorities were so impressed by the visit of Elders Lyman A. Cannon, and highly appreciated to same.

The General and Local Authorities of the Church were present and unanimously sustained.


