As part of the re-funding measures of Congress, and in order to induce banks to accept three per cents. a bond bill was passed by the Senate, unanimously repealing tax on bank deposits, which would have reduced the annual revenues of the government \$6,569,486, as shown by the receipts of 1880. The House committee on ways and means of the last Congress, for like reasons, reported favorably on the bill, repealing the tax on bank deposits, and also the two cent stamp tax on bank check, drafts and orders, amounting in the aggregate to \$8,676,690.
