Although blessed with a good constltution, a somewhat strenuous life torion, a somewhat strendous life brought on complications which, all too soon, ended a useful life and brought sorrow to the large circle of friends and relations. She was born March 28, 1839, in the city of Birming-ham, England; baptized when 8 years cid. She parted with her mother and broke and with a company of Solati home and with a company of Saints started on the journey to Utah in the spring of 1856. She crossed the plains-a journey of over 1,000 miles-in the Pioneer Handcart company, led by Capt. Edmund Ellsworth. She drew her cart-sometimes with only her cart-sometimes with only the means of bare existence, over sand hills and mountains and through streams to

the end of the tedious journey. December 21, 1858, she was married to James A. Little, by President Brig-ham Young, with him she assisted in colonizing St. George, Engle valley and Kanab in Southern Utah. In the latter place she resided until the autumn of \$90 when she moved to Colonia Diaz, Mexico.
