MURDERED HIS WIFE.

John Kingston, a Gambler, Killed Her With a Meat Axe.

With a Meat Axe. Oklahoma City, Oct. 30.-A special to the Oklahoman from Lawton says a mob is forming here with the avowed intention of lynching John Hopkins, a gambler from Kingston, Mo. who last night altacked his wife with a meat ax at the home of her sister, Mrs. Ed Galyon, inflicting wounds from which she died at 6:30 o'clock tonight. Sheriff C. O. Hammond and eight or 16 depu-ties are guarding the jail and threaten to shoot if an attempt is made to take the nrisoner. The acting governor has been asked to send troops. BRITISH PROFESSOR SENT BY HARVARD TO BERLIN. Cambridge, Mass., Oct. 30.—Jerome D. Greene, secretary of the Harvard corporation in speaking of Berlin dis-patches commenting on Harvard's ap-pointment of a British subject as pro-fessor in Germany said: "Prof. Schofield is still a British sub-ject. Although the previous Harvard exchange professorships with Germany have all been Americans it was thought very opportune this year to send a professor who was not... Too much stress has been laid on a supposed diplomatic character of the exchange idea. "In case that were true, we should be obliged, of course, to send only Americans by birth or naturalization, but by sending Prof. Schofield em-phasizes has been laid on the academ-ic idea of the exchange.
