The Indians were at war with Americans beyond the mountain-; and seeing that the people of Utah were friendly, were disposed to be friendly also, and would have remained so but for the acts of the emigrants themselves, and 500 sav ages were upon the warpath at Mountain Meadows; the people of Utah were compelled for their own safety to refrain from irritating the savages, and the most intense excite ment prevailed. The Indians were painted and plumed for war, and here in little valleys the people, in helpless numbers, were surrounded by them. Settlers were unable to protect the emigrants under such circumstances. We deny that Mormons were there through counsel entirely, as some of them went to save the emigrants. Mormons were frequently killed by Indians papers to publish this: in wars, and the military organiza tion was for protection. Thousands of emigrants had been travelling the route of the emigrants to people the Golden State, and travelled in safety, so far as Utah is concerned; why was it that only this train was doomed? Even one portion of it passed through in safety. Our theory is that the emigrants themselves excited the savages to mad ness, and thus worked their own destruction. 
