Cement is selling at \$3.50 per barrel at San Francisco.

Governor Dunn, of Louisiana, is reported to be ill.

The sudden illness of the Prince of Wales is announced.

The King of Denmark has gone to visit his son, King George of Greece.

The bark *Charles* of Aberdeen is reported wrecked, and six of her crew drowned.

Gen. Ord is transferred from the command of the Department of California to the Department of the Platte.

The Bower Gold Mining Co., to operate in Colorado, has been incorporated with a capital of \$1,000,000.

Gen. Trevin's force has cut the telegraph lines between the city of Mexico and Matamoros.

John Gribble, who accused Queen Victoria of intoxication, is refused bail by the magistrates.

Recruits are ordered for the Fifth cavalry, which is assigned duty in Arizona.

The boiler of Grubb's flouring mill at Clinton, Ind., exploded, and killed a man and injured others.

A mule team was murdered in his shop at Cleveland, Ohio, for purposes of robbery.

Count Von Bentz, the newly appointed ambassador from Austria to the court of St. James is expected there this week.

There is a change of ministry in Austria. It is probable that Prince Adolph Auerberg will now be called to form a new cabinet.

The Paris Government has resolved to support the motion for the return of the seat of government to Paris at the next session of the Assembly.

The Spanish Cortes is prorogued until February next, until which time it is probable the present ministry will continue.

There was an explosion of gas on the steamer *Samarra* at Liverpool on Monday night. Seven persons were slightly injured.

The vessels sunk in the *Mary* at Liverpool, bound for Bermuda, and the British ship *Arwen*.

Acting-Governor Cowley of Georgia does not want a special election to fill Bullock's place, and has vetoed the bill therefor.

The Brooklyn Ring has perpetrated frauds on the city treasury, and \$240,000 have been illegally drawn by Fire Commissioners.

The London Times is threatened with a suit for libel by the Dublin jury who acquitted Kelly upon the charge of murdering Talbot, the head constable.

The ship *Yang Tze*, Capt. Smith, from Foo Chow for New York, was lost on a reef in the China sea, and twenty-four of her crew were drowned.

The Prussian navy estimates bill provides for the raising of the pay of naval officers 10 per cent. Minister Von Bismarck is expected to introduce the bill.

The commissioner of internal revenue rules that the principal and interest of the new bonds are exempt from taxation in any form, and that this interest need not be included in the amount upon which a dividend or other taxes are required to be paid.

Francis A. Walker, the new census superintendent, has been appointed Commissioner of Indian Affairs. He will continue his former duties until the census is completed.

It is rumored that James M. Sweney, brother of Peter, has fled to Europe, and that Charles Connor has evidence of fraud by him in connection with Tweed and others. Probably this afternoon another rumor will deny this.

The Commission for the arbitration of the Alabama claims will, it is said, assemble at Geneva on the 13th of Dec., and its deliberations will continue all winter. There will be 600 cases presented.

Victor Emanuel made his entry into Rome yesterday. He was met by his son, the ministers of the crown, and a large body of the National guard of the city. An immense crowd of people was in the streets.

The California Prison Commission elected Gov. H. H. Haight as President, Dr. H. Gibbon, vice-president, J. Woodworth, secretary, and J. W. H. Campbell, A. J. Ralston, W. O. Bond, and David Meeker, trustees.

The cholera has broken out in the western section of Halifax county, N.C. The doctor of the place is supposed to have carried the disease into that county. He is recovering, but other persons who caught the disease from him are dying.

The Governor of South Carolina charges the Treasurer with a fraudulent issue of bonds, or rather the re-selling of bonds which had already been converted into new bonds. The State treasurer and financial agent deny this, and say the Governor is misinformed.

The Swedish consul Neeninger, who has been expelled from Cuba, has sailed for Baltimore, in company with his son. The Neeningers are both American citizens, notwithstanding the fact that the father held office as Swedish consul.

John H. Hunter was hung at Akron, Ohio, yesterday. He had refused to give up his arms, and was so unrepentant that he had to be supported to the scaffold. He wanted to renew an engagement with a girl, and on her parents refusing to permit him to enter the house, he shot them and her. This was the crime for which he was punished.

Treasurer Spinner, in his annual report, complains of the increasing delay on the part of some of the banks in making payments, and the payment of dividends.

He recommends that a percentage on all duty be added for every ten days delay after the month allowed by law. He reports that the receipts for the fiscal year, including the balance of \$149,602,471 in the treasury, June 30, 1870, were \$680,904,349; expenditures \$679,936,572; balance in treasury, June 30, 1870, \$109,917,477. Total number of national banks, June 30, 1871, 1,309.
