SHERIFF ANDREW BURT

Is the Defendant in a Suit for Divorce, Entered This Morning.

ALLEGATIONS OF CRUELTY AND DRUNKENNESS.

A Lengthy Complaint Recites a Tale of Woe Covering Several Years.

In the Third District court this morning, Helen M. Burt brought suit for divorce from her husband, Andrew J. Burt, sheriff of this county.

The parties were married at Logan, on September 10th, 1888, and there is one child, Wallace J., aged two years and two months. Plaintiff alleges that ever since their marriage (and particularly since the birth of the boy) defendant has consistently and habitually treated her in a cruel and inhuman manner, causing her great bodily injury and extreme mental distress. Her husband has been, and still is, the assets, guilty of habitual drunkenness, that is repeated occasions within the past two years he has violently assaulted her, striking, beating, and otherwise mistreating her; that without previous provocation, just now or ever in the course of her marriage, with the intent to injure, she has been beaten, and violently cut the clothing from her person. It is further alleged that on the day previous (February 10th) he "choked her with such violence as to seriously injure her," at the same time threatening to kill both her and the child. That son numberless occasions, both under the influence of liquor and otherwise, defendant has used language which she considers vicious, profane and abusive language and threatened to kill plaintiff and their baby. That defendant habitually uses toward plaintiff a language which she considers coarse, indecent, vulgar, profane and abusive language, at the same time finally and conclusively securing her acquiescence, as up to that time he has been threatening to kill both plaintiff and the child.

Mr. Burt's wife has brought up a case in the Court of Appeals, and it is now in the process of trial.
