

ALL IN LAST TEN MONTHS.

New York, Nov. 3.—In the ten months ending October 31, the metal mining companies in this country reporting to the Engineering and Mining Journal paid a total of \$42,568,071 in dividends. "This is an excellent showing," says that Journal, "of the returns received by capital invested in the metal mining industry."

During these ten months the Amalgamated Copper company, which controls the Anaconda and Parrot companies and a large interest in other companies, declared \$8,000,000 or 8 per cent on its capitalization. The Anaconda Copper company is credited with paying \$1,800,000, or 16 per cent on its capital stock; the Boston & Montana company, \$1,200,000, or 113 per cent; the Parrot company, \$1,379,100 or 69 per cent on its issued capital stock. The Amalgamated Copper company's dividend, however, is really a duplication, as it works no new mines, and its dividend is really derived from the stocks of the other companies which it holds. Of the Michigan Copper companies Calumet & Hecla paid in the ten months, \$5,000,000 or 250 per cent; the Michigan Consolidated Copper company, \$5,000,000, or 35 per cent; Tamarack \$420,000, or 28 per cent. In California the Mountain Copper company paid \$1,200,000, or 19.2 per cent on its share capital of \$6,250,000. The United Verde & Pacific Senator Clark's property is credited with paying \$1,650,000, or 52 per cent on its capital stock, and the Arizona company \$675,420, or 18 per cent. The next large dividend was in the ten months by the gold mining companies, which also produced some silver and lead. In this group the leaders were Stratton's Independence, limited, of Colorado, with \$1,793,337, or 35 per cent on its issued capital stock, and the Colorado \$750,000, or 25 per cent.

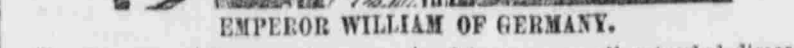
In South Dakota the Homestake Gold Mining company is foremost, with \$1,000,000, or 5 per cent on its share capital of \$20,000,000. The Leadville company paid \$750,000, or 25 per cent on its capitalization, and the Daly-West company \$412,500, or 13.7 per cent. In Alaska the Alaska-Treadwell Gold Mining company paid \$600,000, or 6 per cent on its capital stock. In Arizona the La Puerta Gold Mining company leads with \$252,100, or 93 per cent on its capitalization, and in California we have the Yellow Aster Copper company, which paid \$200,000, or 40 per cent. Of the silver-lead dividend payers those in Idaho are the most prominent, being the Empire State-Idaho Mining company, with \$295,431, or 30 per cent on its issued capital of \$984,769. The Standard company, with \$205,000, or 59 per cent; Buffalo-Hump, \$223,000 or 10 per cent and the Bunker Hill Sullivan company with \$210,000, or 7 per cent. Of the lead and zinc mining companies the largest dividend was the St. Joseph Lead company leads with \$112,500, or 4.5 per cent on its issued share capital. There have also been numerous smaller dividend payers, mostly in the silver-lead and zinc mining industry, while in the lead and zinc section the number has grown less, owing in part to the end of the speculative bubble which favored the incorporation of new companies. In the copper and silver-lead instances, paid out monthly dividends.

"The dividend disbursements mentioned above do not include those made by the coal and iron mines, oil companies and the metal smelting and refining companies, which have been enormous in the past ten months. There are also many private corporations that do not report their dividends, and these, if added, would bring the grand total paid to stockholders in dividends to a very large amount, unequalled probably by any other industry in this country."

## HAWAIIAN LAWS CONSTRUED.

Those in Force at Time of Annexation in Force Until Changed.

Honolulu, Oct. 25, via San Francisco, Nov. 2.—[Correspondence Associated Press.]—United States District Judge Estee has rendered a decision to the effect that the "Constitution does not follow the flag," in an important legal case that has been before the courts here for some time.

William A. Marshall was sentenced to six months' imprisonment for criminal libel on account of publications he made about the late Chief Justice

Judge E. A. Tamm, taking a view opposed to that of Judge Estee, has already released a prisoner who was convicted of an infamous crime without a grand jury indictment, but the circuit judge to whom Marshall's appeal went, found for the other way. The result is the release of one man and the confirmation of the sentence of another, though both appealed on exactly the same points.

What is needed more is more of the kind of thoroughgoing reform which will open the army on democratic lines to the masses of the nation. There will be many technical improvements in the services and weak spots in the system of imperial defence will be closed, but the bulk of the army is not likely to be any infusion of fresh blood into the army.

Politicians assert that in place of the clean sweep of rusty functionaries the cabinet changes have merely strengthened the grip of Mr. Chamberlain's administration. There are many people who see Mr. Chamberlain's fine Roman hand in everything that happens in public life.

No official announcement has yet been made of further changes in the personnel of the government and it is evident that Lord Salisbury has not finished his task of reorganization. Irish Nationalists as well as Unionists derive satisfaction from the rumour that Mr. Wyndham will be appointed chief secretary for Ireland. While Arthur Balfour occupied this office Mr. Wyndham, acting as his private secretary, won many friends in Ireland among all classes.

**Would be Suicido**—**James Better.**

New York, Nov. 2.—Charles F. Jones, the personal attendant of the late William M. Rice, who attempted to commit suicide yesterday, was visited in the hospital today by Dr. Christian, who has him in charge. Dr. Christian said that he was very much impressed by the hearing of the application by the proponents of the "Baker" will of the late Mr. Rice, that the latter will was alleged to be in the possession of Assistant District Attorney Osborne, and that the will should be placed on file in the office of the surrogate was today adjourned until November 20. Assistant District Attorney Osborne said today it is his opinion that more than a general conspiracy to get possession of Rice's property. He was asked if there would be any further arrests and said not at this time, stating it would be first necessary to get the suicide.

**Ten Taster Upham Suicides.**  
Chicago, Nov. 2.—Abel P. Upham, government tea expert, committed suicide at his residence here last night by taking carbolic acid. Illness brought on by excessive tea tasting is said to have been the cause of the act. Mr. Upham was known in all the large tea importing houses from coast to coast.

**Candidate Woolley in Michigan.**  
Detroit, Mich., Nov. 2.—John G. Woolley, Prohibition candidate for President and party, entered Michigan today for their second tour of the State. Mr. Woolley opened the day's campaigning with a speech at 8 o'clock from the platform of his car. A small audience heard him urge that "it is the duty of all enlightened electors to vote the Prohibition ticket."

**Receivers Appointed.**  
Philadelphia, Oct. 2.—Judge McPherson, in the United States district court upon the request of the creditors of Thomas & Sons and the Phoenix Mills company, has appointed receivers for the firm of Thomas Walstenholme and Frank H. Keene. Further argument will be heard as to the appointment of a third receiver. The two concerns, which are practically the same are manufacturers of worsted yarns and have combined liabilities of \$2,140,000. Depression in business and the borrowing of \$1,000,000 of wool pledged with them is said to have caused their failure.

### Swindled the Macabees.

Shamekin, Pa., Nov. 2.—O. J. Reed, an ex-councilman, who was recently convicted of conspiracy in connection with the borough paving contracts and admitted to bail upon the decision of the superior court of a new trial, disappeared three days ago. Last night it was discovered the local lodge of Macabees, of which he was a member, had been swindled out of \$6,000 by forged death certificate of Benjamin Davis and Thomas Schorer. Davis, who was in Michigan, notified he was listed as dead in the official newspaper of the order, informed his relatives here that he was alive. He started an inquiry into the matter and learned that Siegel, of Port Huron, Mich., who is a high official of the order. After a close investigation the irregularities were discovered.

**Mr. Cleveland Going Duck Shooting**

New York, Nov. 2.—Ex-President Cleveland arrived here today from Princeton and called to see his friend E. C. Benedict, at the latter's office. Mr. Cleveland denied himself to all interviews.

A representative of the firm of Benedict & Company said that the ex-President and Mr. Benedict were going out of town for a few days. He said that they were going on a duck shooting expedition down in Maryland, and they would not return before the latter part of next week.

**Russian Troops for Far East.**  
Hamburg, Nov. 2.—The Russian government has commissioned the Hamburg-American steamship line to transport troops between Odessa and the far east. The Hamburg-American line has purchased the Brazil and River plate fleet, belonging to A. C. de Freitas & Co., of Hamburg, and is now negotiating with the Hamburg and South American steamship company for

joint working of their respective governments.
