

A SATURDAY SESSION**To Begin** **Utah's** **Market Day** **For**
Legislative Business.**A BUSTER BILL ON RAILROADS.****Introduction** **of** **a** **bill** **to** **Regulate**
Charters **for** **Banks** **or** **Births** **in** **Sleep-**
ing **Cats**—**For** **Farmers.****Yesterday** **afternoon** Mr. Benson in-
troduced, by request, a new state
bill, which embodies the ideas of
Judge Powers on this subject. The
bill was referred to the managerial com-
mittee.**He** **then** **introduced** a bill **regulating** **bills** **fighting**, **or**
money **fighting**, **and** **bill** **fighting**, **or**
payable, **in** **this** **state**, **a** **felony**,
punishable, **by** **imprisonment**, **in**
the **state** **prison**, **from** **one** **to** **three**
years. **He** **said**, **and** **the** **present** **law**,
which **prohibits** **everything** **but** **bills** **fighting**,
there **were** **very** **little** **justified**
expelling **of** **that** **kind** **over** **occurred**
in **the** **state**, **so** **we** **move** **that** **con-**
sideration **of** **the** **bill** **be** **postponed**
to **order**. **The** **motion** **carried**, **and**
the **bill** **was** **referred** **to** **the** **engineering** **and**
mineral **committee**, **to** **be** **merged** **into**
one **bill**, **of** **some** **understanding**
in **all** **their** **respective** **committees**. **Carried**
unanimously.**TODAY'S PROCEEDINGS.**
All the House remained business

The Enrollment committee reported
that it had presented to the
Speaker H. B. 12, 13, 14, 15, and House
concurred.**NEW BILLS.**
H. B. 16, was introduced by Currie,
relating to the annual tributes for the
support of citizens of the State in
various branches of agriculture. The
tributes shall be held annually at
one time in each county and under
the direction of the Board of Education
of the State. The agricultural colleges,
both first and second times, were re-
ferred to the agriculture committee.**H. B. 17,** was introduced by Bolton,
provides for an act to regulate the
ways of the railroads, and to make
them all open to all men or companies
running sleeping cars over any or the lines of rail-
roads in this State, and fixes the maximum
charge for each car of both rail-
roads and cars per mile.**CAUGHT BY AN ENGINE.****Mrs.** **South** **Knox** **died** **down** **and**
