LOCAL BRIEFS.

Mrs. Amanda Curtis of this city, has been adjudged insane by Judge Ritchie, and ordered committed to the state mental hospital at Provo.

The telephone operators had a busy time of it last night in answering inquiries about the Fitzsimmons fight and the Rio Grande shops fire.

The rush of Christmas business has made it necessary to employ extra help in the postoffice and express offices. The traffic is heavier than ever before.

There will be a civil service examination in this city, Jan. 10 next, for the position of telephone operator, with pay ranging from \$240 to \$340 per annum.

There will be a Temple Chanukah (Feast of Lights) party for the children of the Sabbath school of the Congregation B'nai Israel of this city at 2:30 p. m., Dec. 26, in Unity hall.

Editor James A. Metcalf of the Western Homeowner magazine at Missoula, Mont., promises the Commercial club of this city his support in the "See America First" movement.

The Ladies Literary club will give a "Children's day" on the 23rd inst., with a program to be followed by a spread. The children of members of the club will be the guests of the afternoon.

The Citizens' Heating & Power company yesterday increased its capitalization from \$250,000 to \$500,000, by filing an amendment to the articles of incorporation. The shares are \$1 each at par.

The board of dental examiners made a report to Governor Cutler yesterday afternoon, reviewing conditions for the year. Nineteen new men have been examined and recommended for positions, as dentists.

Governor Cutler has named President W. J. Kerr of the Logan Agricultural college, and J. M. Bolitha of Richfield as delegates to the "See America First" conference which will meet here January 25, 1906.

The old Black Rock bathing resort has passed into the hands of F. J. Senor, and there is talk of interesting eastern capital there with a view to rehabilitating the place and making of it a model summer resort.

Chicken thieves are reported as plentiful in the vicinity of Tenth South and West Temple street. Last night the lock from a coop was removed, with a crowbar or lever of some sort, and about 30 chickens were taken.

Adjutant H. P. Nelson of the Salvation army will give a basket dinner Saturday from 10 a. m. to 3 p. m., to the worthy poor of the city. On Christmas day, the army will have a tree for the poor children with a wide assortment of gifts.

Tonight in the National Guard armory the patriotic entertainment arranged as a benefit for company 41 of the guard, will be given. An excellent program has been arranged, and rehearsals have been held for over a month. A pleasant time is assured those who attend.

The new road from Los Angeles is making things interesting for the Salt Lake postoffice, as all the registered mail east bound from southern California has to be checked up at this point, as Salt Lake is a relay station; and moreover, the Salt Lake office is the distributing point for all registered matter destined for the southern part of the state.

U. S. Marshal Wilcox, who came to Salt Lake to secure the person of Robert Folson, left last night with his prisoner. The half-breed Indian is wanted for the murder of Alfred Strickland, and escaped while out on bonds of \$5,000. He will be tried at Durant, Indian Territory, if the marshal succeeds in landing him at the penitentiary.

SALT LAKE RESERVE.  
Forester Hadley Says New Trees Will Be Planted in the Spring.

Forester W. B. Hadley of the department of agriculture is at the Cullen today en route for Flagstaff to take charge there of the local forestry work. He says that steps will be taken in the spring to replant the Salt Lake forest reserve with trees for the protection of the water supply. The trees to be planted are Douglas spruce, Engelmann spruce and western yellow pine. On May 1 next a late fencing 8 feet high and 90x60 feet in area will be erected at the nursery site and pine tree seeds planted. After a year, the young trees will be transplanted and watched for two years when they are to be set out on the mountain sides. Mr. Hadley took his degree of master of forestry at Yale in 1904.

FRANK EDWARDS HAS  
PLAYED IN HARD LUCK.

After spending about one-third of his life in prison, Frank Edwards is to leave the Utah penitentiary tomorrow for Folsom, California, to serve the greater portion of a 15-year sentence. He escaped from Folsom at a favorable opportunity soon after being arrested and sentenced for burglary in 1897. On escaping he beat his way to Ogden, and half-finished, took 40 cents worth of food from an Ogden residence. He was caught and for the crime received a 10-year sentence in the Utah penitentiary. During the outbreak of 1897 he escaped with Tracy, who afterwards became the worst criminal in the records of the Pacific coast, but on going east to Missouri, he was overtaken by watchful officers, while making a "get-away" after a "porch climbing" episode, and received a three-year sentence.

He was returned to Utah on its completion, and will finish his sentence here tomorrow. Now he must back track to California to complete the 15-year sentence.

Since 1901 Edwards has settled down in the prison and has earned a reputation for good behavior. He never was a dangerous criminal, and in his escapes took no part in the efforts to take the lives of guards. He seems to have played in "hard luck" in receiving stiff sentences for burglary and to have been caught in each trick tried to turn. He is now 50 years of age, and has recently completed a course in electrical engineering taken at a correspondence school. Warren Pratt and other officials of the prison have forwarded to Gov. Pardee of California, a request that he consider the good behavior of Edwards, and a statement that they believe he will become a good citizen if given another chance.

Acquisition papers have been honored by Gov. Cutler, for the return of Edwards to Folsom, and the prisoner will leave tomorrow in custody of Geo. E. Lamphrey, turnkey of the prison, who is here to receive him.
