THE FIRST SESSION WILL BE AT LOGAN

Deseret Summer Institute is to Open in the Temple City.

TRAINING COURSE FOR TEACHERS

Work in English and Science by Celebrated Teachers-School to be Permanent Under Church Board.

The first session of a new summer school will be held this year at Logan, Utah. This school will represent the combined efforts of the three leading Church schools of the state, neither of which will hold a teacher's summer school hereafter. The school at Logan this year is the first of a series, and hereafter the school will be held in a place to be selected each year by the committee. This school will therefore take the place of the summer school hretofore held by the Brigham Young college at Logan and the Brigham Young university at Provo. The Latter-day Saints' university will also cooperate in the movement, though it has never yet held a summer institute for teachers. The combined summer school will be held from June 20 to July 29 of this year.

Arrangements for reduced rates on the railroads have been perfected, and the fare for the round trip will be 1 1-5 of the usual rates. The summer school is to be known as the Deseret Summer institute, and is under the immediate institute, and is under the immediate supervision of the Church school board of examiners. This board is composed of General Supt. J. M. Tanner, and. Presidents James H. Linford of the Brigham Young college, George Ho Brimhall of the Brigham Young univer-sity, and J. H. Paul of the Latter-day Saints' university. This board has com-pleted arrangements for giving all the courses usually given it this part of the country *e* the summer school. A special feature of the work this year will be the English language and literature. Prof. Seward of the Univer-

year will be the English language and literature. Prof. Seward of the Univer-sity of California has been engaged for this service. He will give a course in technical English grammar, emphasiz-ing the difficulties of the subject, illus-trating the technical points in the teaching thereof, and covering com-pletely the usual high school course in grammar. He will also give a course in literature for more advanced students. These courses will be of the highest utility for those who expect to go more utility for those who expect to go more deeply into the study of Eng-lish literature than has been customary at the summer schools. A course in rhetoric and composition will also be given by Professor Seward. It is supposed that every student will take one or more of the courses in English seward. Arrangements are also being made for the engagement of a thorough teacher of science; either physics and chemistry or biology. The board is now in communication with seven of the leading college presidents of the Unit-ed States, and the man selected for scicance may be depended upon as first elass in every respect. It is supposed that nearly every student will take one of the courses in science given by this professor. In addition to these leading courses, it has been decided to give courses, it mathematics measured give courses in mathematics, pedagogy and psychology, art and manual training, and kindergarten. For mathema-tics, Professor Joseph L. Horne of the Latter-day Saints' university has been engaged. He will give courses in alge-bra, geometry, and trigonometry. For pedagogy Professor Mosiah Hall of the Brigham Young college has been se-cured. He will give a course in psychology and education. For art and man-ual training, Professor Albert East-mond of the Brigham Young university has been secured. He will give the fundamentals of the course, which he has been giving to the Utah county schools during the past year. It is not yet ascertained who will be the instructor in kindergarten theory and practise, but it is believed that either Miss Jones, the successful kindergarten teacher of Art section specials Logan, or Mrs. Donnette S. The school will be open to all teachers and students eligible to pursue its courses, and will be nonsectarian in character. Only a small fee will be charged for attendance, and considerable freedom in election of studies will be allowed.
