Vreeland Measure Rejected by House Committee May Be Adopted at Conference.

# PAYNE PROPOSITION TO FORE.

Speaker of Opinion That Members Would Not Care to Remain Week More to Hear Discussion.

Washington, May 4 .- Nothwithstanding the fact that the committe on banking and currency today voted to table, the new Vreeland financial bill the impression prevailed among many members that the measure will be adopted at the conference of Repu + can members of the house to be head tomorrow night.

The vote in the committee, by which the Vreeland bill was tabled, was 13

The vote in the committee, by which the Vreeland bill was tabled, was 13 to 3, Messrs. Weeks, Burton and Me-kinney voting in the negative. The committee adopted a resolution offered by Mr. Waldo, New York, requesting that suitable time be given, a week of possible, for discussion in the house of all pending curency measures. Chair-man Fowier was authorized to lay this request before Speaker Cannon. During the afternoon strong efforts were made to reach a compromise on the financial question, and the propo-sition advocated some time ago by Re-publican Floor Leader Payne was taken up by Chairman Fowler as the basis for an agreement. The proposition al-lows any national banking association, which has circulating notes cutstand-ing secured by deposit of United States bonds to an amount equal to its capi-tal stock actually paid in, to take out additonal circulation upon depositing United States bonds or certificates of indebetedness authorized during the Spanish-American wars. The proposi-tion was acceptable to some of the house leaders, and also to members of the banking and currancy committee. It was at first thought by offering the banking and currency committee. It was at first thought by offering this proposition as an amendment to the Fowler curency commission bill the conference which has been called for tomorrow night could be obviated. When the plan was laid before Speak-When the plan was laid before Speak-er Camon, together with the request of the committee for a week's debate, he informed Chairman Fowler that he had authority to call off the confer-ence or to grant the time for debate asked for. He staed that more than a sufficient number of Republicans had signed the call for the conference and that it was for the conference to determine what measures should be

and that it was for the conference to determine what measures should be decided upon, eH gave it as his openion that the members would not care to stay here an additional week listening to the financial discussion.
