## ITALY BANKRUPT.

**A** Debt of Seventy-eight Millions Lire for the Last Five Years.

## FINANCIAL REFORMS TO BE LOOKED FOR.

**A** Series of Economic Measures Implemented by the Vatican, Too.

## ITALY'S DEFICIT.

It Has Swelled to over Fifteen Millions Lire.

Brown July 27.—It is announced that the Italian deficit for the year 1900 will be 15 millions lire, and that all the economy measures to further diminish the expense-sweeping reductions will make the deficit of 15 millions and even more. The deficit of course will be reduced. Fifteen thousand men were sent away for economic reasons to receive medical treatment, and the money given them, or retained in the army for the present.

The recent heavy losses in the Vatican have complicated the financial situation still more. In consequence of the Italian events of Maryland, Virginia, and the Department of Columbia, asking for the withdrawal of their troops from the United States, it is anticipated that the government will favor the exhibited all that is possible, but as a matter of principle, it cannot take an active part.
