the republic of Poland in the seventeenth century weakened her. With these conquests Russia doubled her nayal power, though the European con-stellation did not yet permit her the conquest of Constantinople, her cherished aim which would make at least the eastern basin of the Mediterranean a. Russian lake. England successfully thwarted this cherished goal of Russia. Meanwhile, in the expectation of some suspicious opportunity in this direction, she turned through the unbounded tun-dras of Siberia to the conquest of the Facilie.
