BUILDING ROAD TO NEW SMELTER

Gang Put to Work Grading Road-bed for Road to Pine Canyon Plant.

WORK STARTED YESTERDAY.

Plans for 2,000 Ton Smelter Have Not Been Finished—Will Cost Between Two and Three Millions.

A gang of men was set to work yesterday morning at Tooele city to do the grading for the new road of the International Smelting company to Pine canyon where the smelter is to be built.

Nine teams are now at work at Tooele and 17 single hands are throwing up the grade. This gang will be added to shortly, as soon as the work will warrant the hiring of additional men.

It is understood that the plans for the new smelter have not been ratified as yet by the board of directors of the company and that all of the plans have not been drawn up.

TEMPORARY BUILDINGS.

At Pine canyon a score or more of workmen are busy erecting the temporary buildings for the accommodation of the large force that will be necessary to push the plans through so as to have the plant in running order within a year.

East Tintic Development was again the liveliest stock on the mining exchange this morning. The price has found its way into the market on this stock and the story of the recent strike on the Tintic property tended to make shares change hands.
