COMETARY-NEW THEORY

If you want to see the comet now you must get up in the morning early, before the morning light appears or dawning has begun. By the by, Prof. Lorenze Rank, of Chicago, presents a new thing about comets and their tails. comet, he says, being a body of atmosphere, a transparent globe, the rays of the sun, striking it, instead of being absorbed or reflected, pass right on through it. By the friction thus undergone they become heated and consequently produce light and become visible. In this heated condition these rays leave the comet and pass off into space, remaining visible so long as they retain the heat, and thus forming the so-called comet's tail, the surface of the the rays toward a focus, thus causing the frequent fan-shaped tails.
