

the City of Salt Lake, Utah: The petitioners, the Second South Street Cable Transway Company, of Salt Lake City, do most respectfully request your at-tention to the subject matter of this petition, viz the propulsion of street cars upon Second South Street in this city by means of an end-less cable, operated by a stutionary engine, for the purpose of moving freight and passen-gers upon said street, and no other, within the corporate limits, and under the comirol of your honorable body. The said company have acquired the right to use the patents controlling this system, now so successfully in use in San Francisco and the East. Ihat shid petitioners do piedge themselves to con-form to all rules and regulations relating to the operation of passenger train cars in this store and the construct in a substantial man-ner all menches in which airs cables are pissed, and that the slot or a true opening into such trench or tube shall not exceed seven eighths of minoh in width; that the road shall conform to the official grade of the sizet. Nothing in this arant should it be configured - stall be considered in any wise to proven the proper authorities of said city from severing, grading, paving, planking, remining or all work be considered in any when to provent the proper authorities of said oits from severing, and ng, paving, planking, repairing or alter-ing any portion of said street, but all work shall be done if possible so as not to obstruct the free passage of cars upon said road, and the politioners further agree that they will be hable and keep in good order and repair with the same material as may be in use on the contigious portions of the street over which franchise may extend and be embrased with-in the space eccupied, by their track or tracks between their rails, and for two fest ou either side thereof. Your petitioners further agree to at all times supply such a number of cars as may be necessary for the passenger traind of said road; and the petitioners humbly pray also that the term of the franchise for which they petition shall be twenty-five years. 


