CLOSING EXERCISES.

End of a Term of the Salt Lake Academy.

The closing exercises of the second term of the second year of the Salt Lake State Academy took place today. The choir sang "Providence is Over All." Prayer by Denmore Duncan. Singing, "The Bright New Year." Edward Tucker, in behalf of the students, made an address, expressing great satisfaction with the studies and management of the school, and especially with the instruction in theology which he had received. The young ladies were represented by Miss Louise Brockbank, who made an address in a similar strain.

Brother Willard Croxall reported his labors as assistant teacher in the Intermediate Department; could see a marked improvement in the students. A few seemed uninterested; but the great majority were commendable.

Brother Joseph Nelson gave a report of the Preparatory Department, commending punctuality of the students, most of whom had been interested in their studies. He reported the arithmetic, bookkeeping and physiology of the higher department.

Brother Willard Croxall regretted that not more visitors were present. Took pleasure in reporting his labors, and pride in the advancement of the great majority of the students. But few of the students had taken part in the higher branches, such as phonography, physics, general history, but those who had done so had taken great interest.

"All Nature Invites Our Praise to God," was the theme of the address. Brother Done reported that according to the programme the rest of the session should be given to the handling of the board, but as none of them were present he would ask some of the visitors to address the school. This invitation was followed by remarks from two or three visitors, when the exercises ended with singing and benediction.

THE LEGISLATURE.

COUNCIL.

The Council convened at the session hour. After the opening exercises, Wimmer presented a petition from Jasper Robertson and 310 others praying for an appropriation by the legislature of \$3,000 to be applied to the purchase of the town of Ashley, and Price rivers in Emery County. Referred to the committee on appropriations.

Marshall called for the second reading of C. F. 5, a bill providing for the classification and government of municipal corporations. The bill passed its second reading and was amended. A. J. B. Clay introduced a communication conveying his thanks for the freedom of the Council extended.

At 12:30 p. m. on motion of Olsen, the Council adjourned until Monday, the 31st inst., at 2 p. m.

HOUSE.

JANUARY 29, 1888.

The first thing after the opening exercises was the reading of a communication from the Governor, announcing his approval of the compilation bill. Hetch introduced a petition from 200 citizens of the town of Ashley, asking the removal of the town of Ashley to the upper room of the Social Hall. This bill rendered it possible to increase the number of students from the former maximum of 84 to that of 115. THIS FACILITY.

It will appear from the foregoing statistics that the Faculty has consisted of three teachers, whose class-work has been as follows: Willard Croxall, 84, Joseph Nelson, 47, and Willard Done, 35, weekly recitations. Methods of teaching in the various branches have been explained from time to time in order to secure uniformity of method in teaching. This enables a student to pass from one grade to another without suffering the inconvenience of a change of method between the two teachers. Plans have been laid out in all the classes, which cannot be departed from except by recommendation of the class teacher, and the consent of the Principal; the register of studies now before you shows that these plans have been completely carried out.

THE DOMESTIC ORGANIZATION.

has been organized, as before, of the daily recitation in theology, the general Theological Class on Wednesday afternoon, the general Theological Recitation on Monday afternoon, and the daily opening and closing exercises with singing and prayer. 334 departments being located in the same building, the last named exercises have been conducted jointly, instead of separately as before. The course in Compendium theology has been continued in the Intermediate Department while in the Preparatory the history of God's chosen people, as recorded in the Bible and the Book of Mormon, has formed the subject of instruction. The students have been given opportunity of hearing their testimonies on every alternate Wednesday, the response to the call for testimonies being very prompt and general.

According to standing the students are tabulated as follows: Elders 4, Friends 4, Teachers 1, Deacons 4, Lay Members 121; total 134.
