ST. LOUIS, Nov. 19.—A telegram from Parsons, Kansas, says that aid has been asked from the fire which started to extinguish the more than two hours there this morning and now threatens to consume the city. A high wind blowing and the flames are spreading in every direction.

PRESCOTT, A. T., Nov. 19.—The boiler in W. Z. Wilson & Co.'s saw mill, nine miles from here, exploded this morning, killing W. Z. Wilson, one of the proprietors; Timothy Cooley, engineer; J. B. Akers, foreman and three workmen. A number of other employees were severely injured. Wilson's body was torn to two pieces.

**Anti-Saloon Republicans.**

New York, Nov. 19.—The New York State Anti-Saloon Republican League has issued an address to the republicans of this state, calling upon all who are interested in the movement to place the party in the state on a platform of open opposition to the saloons, to meet with the league, in a conference at Syracuse, December 15th and 16th. **FOREST FIRES.**

**MEMPHIS, Tenn., Nov. 19.**—For the past ten days forest fires have been raging all around this section of country and, owing to the extreme dryness of the country, the fires have been of high winds, are becoming more numerous and are doing a fearful straining every nerve to save their residences, and several have been burned out. The railroads are blocked at several places, the bridges are burned, the bridges and the falling of burnings, fires, and telegraph communication is seriously injured with the result that less rain comes soon, the damage will be very great. Much apprehension is felt.

**LITTLE ROCK, Ark., Nov. 19.**—The Grandfather flouring mills and elevators here have been burned out this morning. Loss, \$300,000; Insurance, \$140,000. Adjoining buildings were damaged to the extent of \$20,000.

**NEW ORLEANS ALSO AFFLICTED.**

**NEW ORLEANS, Nov. 19.**—The city is filled with smoke

to-night and the same conditions are reported from Yazoo City, and from many points in Mississippi. Yazoo and Natchez, Vicksburg and other points on the Mississippi being impeded on the fires along the Tallahatchie and Mississippi rivers. The fires are raging on Honey Island at Kilby Lake and much damage from the fires is reported in Southern Kansas.

**ISLIPSPRING, Mich., Nov. 19.**—A forest fire has been burning for some time from the northeast. There are a number of belated passenger and freight trains on the line. The fire is feared some have suffered. At 6 o'clock to-night the gale is blowing more violently than during the day.

**Criminal Cases.**

**SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 19.**—The United States grand jury has found important against ex-customs inspectors William B. Boyd and Edward D. Ciprico and six other inspectors, for illegally aiding and abetting the landing in the United States of Chinese persons. The charges are conspiracy and uttering forged certificates. For years the customs inspectors have been issuing certificates that have been stolen from the customs office. The different grand juries have investigated the case, but were not found sufficient proof to warrant issuing indictments. One of

against Ciprico and Boyd is that, stealing a hundred certificates from the customs house in January, 1897. The collector at this port said today there is evidence of a long series of frauds; that at least eight or ten thousand certificates have illegally found their way to China and been sold, it means that eight or ten thousand Chinamen not legally entitled to enter the United States, have entered.

NEW YORK, Nov. 19.—Private letters from Guatemala bring the following intelligence:

Archbishop Raelu has gone to the United States. The government of Guatemala forced him to leave the republic. The charges against him were insubordination and a tendency to interfere in political concerns. The old cabinet of President Barrios has been re-elected. Mr. Horne, of London, after months of patient diplomacy, has obtained a formal recognition of the great debt due the English bondholders and has brought about a settlement.

DUBLIN, Nov. 19.—The governor of Tullamore jail heard today that clothing for the use of O'Brien had been smuggled into the prison. He at once proceeded to the cell and found the prisoner up and wearing a suit of tweed.

**The Disturbing Element.**

NEWARK, N. J., Nov. 19.—Police Captain Gloria, who made a complaint against Eugene William's saloon as a disorderly house, because of the noisy anarchist meeting held last Sunday, has received a letter written in German, saying that his life will soon be taken by the "committee of American nihilists." Other "capitalist hirelings" are also to be exterminated. Captain Gloria says if any moves are made, he will arrest every anarchist in the city.

NEW YORK, Nov. 19.—A number of anarchists, among whom was Johann Most, gathered at their headquarters tonight for the purpose of holding a meeting, but fearing the police and

by any total eclipse of the sun ever

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 19.—The com-

tension completed its labors for the  
today. The chief business was the  
fixing of the apportionment of amount  
to be raised from the several confer-  
ences next year, and the amounts au-  
thorized to be given for the relief  
of the Chinese in the Philippines.  
The committee of apportionment ask  
for a total of \$387,150.

In Quarantine.

NEW YORK, Nov. 19.—The steamer  
*Syrus*, from Rio Janeiro, arrived  
this port to-day, and was detained  
at anchor for quarantine at sunset.  
She had only seven passengers.  
A child died from the disease on  
the 11th inst. and another at sunset.  
The steamer *Wasaland* from Antwerp  
was also detained at quarantine as  
she had a case of cholera, which was  
from the cholera district.

The Temperance People.

NASHVILLE, Nov. 19.—The national  
convention of the Women's Christian  
Temperance Union today adopted res-  
olutions declaring against the inter-  
vention system.

At the session of the con-  
vention, resolutions were passed  
supporting the Blair educational bill,  
and the prohibition of liquor in  
politics, urging a temperance attack  
at Washington to look after the  
country's interests, and the  
preservation of the Christian Sabbath  
equal suffrages, scientific temperance  
instruction, work among the colored  
people, and the prohibition of  
former resolution regarding the pro-  
hibition party.
