The amount of gold and silver annually taken from the mines of Europe, including Russia, is 26,805 kilogrammes of the former (27-10 pounds to the kilogramme), and 161,444 kilogrammes of the latter, valued together at \$25,000,000.

In America, including California, the annual product is 169,834 kilog: ammes of gold, and 735,-180 kilogrammes of silver, worth, in all, \$146,000,-000.

In Africa, no silver mines are wrought, and only 4,020 kilogrammes of gold are produced, valued at \$8,000,000.




