

When it is considered that the powers when it is considered that the powers now controlling this pretended construction at the present time actually own two lines to the Pacific coast, towit. The old Central Pacific and the present Southern Pacific, via Los Anbeles to New Orleans, nobody not qualified for a place in an asylum for the feeble-minded can suppose for a moment that these people would care to construct a third line to the Pacific coast, except for the purpose of coast a third line to the Pacific coast, except for the purpose of atrangling a rival whose advent they believe would destroy the monopoly of Salt Lake and Utah transportation business, which they have expended so much money and care within the past few months to build us. And it is come. few months to build up, And it is equal-ly apparent that should the present Clark organization abandoned its enterprise and sell out, the Union Pacific Oregon Short Line road, which is now being so industriously laid with second-hand material west of Uvada, would again sink into the slumber which has been the principal characteristic of its existence for mare than ten years past.
But there is behind the present San
Pedro, Los Angeles & Salt Lake Rallroad company sufficient capital to build the road. The road can be built, and when it is built it will find at Salt Lake an eastern connection which will make it independent of the powers at present controlling the Union Pacific and Oregon Short Line, and which will give to the people of Salt Lake a competing railroad, and in doing so will destroy the monopoly now being attempted of commerce of Salt Lake City and of the State of Utah. HAS SPENT \$500,000.

Since the first of January the San Pedro, Los Angeles & Salt Lake Railroad company has expended over half a million dollars in preliminary preparations for the active prosecution of its enterprise, and while it has not seen fit to take into its confidence any of the employes of the Oregon Short Line, it has not neglected the matter of location for yards and shops in Salt Lake City. Among other things which it has done, our company has purchased for eash the title of the Utah & California Railroad company to the grade in dispute; and this, be it remembered is the title which the Union Pacific-Oregon Short Line people not only con-sented to the Utah & California company acquiring, but actually assisted in to acquire in every way within their power. Our company has also made a contract with the Lincoln County, Nevada, for acquring the title which that county acquired to the grade under the tax sale of the grade which the Union Bacific Oreans Short Line appropriation Pacific-Oregan Short Line aggregation permitted. Now these people come in nearly ten years after having aban-doned their enterprise and attempt to assert title to a grade which in the first place they endeavored to assist the Utah & California to obtain possession of, and in addition forfeited for non-payment of taxes. And this they are doing after we have arranged to obtain possession of both these titles.
