The end of the criminal calendar of the Third District Court was reached this morning, when the indictment found by the grand jury against the Salt Lake City Brewing Company, for permitting a nuisance in the vicinity of their premises, was brought up before Judge Zane.

The defendants were represented by ex-City Attorney Hall, who on behalf entered a plea of guilty, with an accompanying explanation. As previously stated in the news, the alleged nuisance consisted of an overflow of water and refuse from the pipes at the brewery over the roadway and into the neighboring alleys.

Mr. Hall said that, at an expense to the defendant company of about \$200, wooden pipes were laid down some distance to carry away the surplus from the brewery. When three breaks or more, they were replaced by iron pipes by the defendants. The water which flowed from the brewery through the iron pipes was "practically clear."
