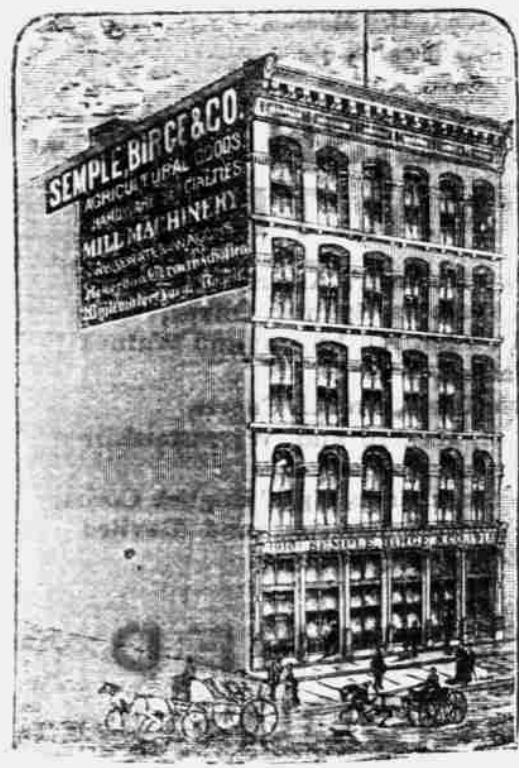

FORT LINCOLN, D. T., Sept. 20, 1876.

Quarantine to be Enforced. SHREVEPORT, La., 28.—At a meeting of the business men and physicians, held this evening, it was decided to quarantine the river against New Orleans.

The following telegrams passed in reference to the Shreveport quarantine: "New Orleans, 28.—To the President of the Board of Health: 'Our Board of Health report the fever diminishing no new cases since the 25th. J. H. Jones has the steamer Down loaded to go this evening. Can we send her? Can you send doctors down the river to examine the boats and pass them if all right? We will pay the expenses.'"
