GOULD WON MATCH. London, April 20.-Jay Gould won the semi-final in the international tennis championship games today, defeating Page in three straights, 6-0, 6-0, 6-2. Page was outclassed by the young American. Gould and Pennell, the champion of 1904, will meet in the final tomorrow. Conscious of the critism evoked by its postponement of a decision, the exec-utive committee of the Court Tennis as-sociation met this afternoon Instead of tomorrow, and decided that Miles, the holder of the championship, shall be per-mitted to defend the title and that the winner of tomorrow's final may challenge the champion to play for the title May 4.
