The famous monument to President Brigham Young and the Pioneers, which stands on the historic sile where East Temple and South Temple streets cross, under the shadow of the Temple on one hand, the Zion's Bank building on the other, with the old and the new Deseret News structures on the others, is now entirely completed, with the exception of the granite coping which is to replace the wooden fence now surrounding f. The filustration shows the statue looking down East Temple street, southward; the figure of the Indian faces east, that of the trapper west.

As every one knows, the monument was designed by the Utah sculptor, C. E. Dallin. Its cost to date has been \$34,897.08, of which the sculptor has been paid for his services in full, \$25,750; the Pioneer Monument association, which has the construction in hand, sill owes about \$5,000; the coping will cost \$2,000, leaving the sum of \$10,000 yet to be raised by popular subscription. The amounts raised thus far have all / been from donations, mostly from the various Stakes of the Church Sums have also been contributed by people not members of the Church.

The Pioneer Monument association was formed in 1891, James Sharp being appointed president, Willard Young, vice-president, Heber M. Wells, secretary and Ellas A. Smith treasurer. The monument was unveiled on the fiftheth anniversary of the arrival of the Pioneers, July 24, 1897, during the Jubilee ceremonies; the bas relief of the Ploneer group and the figures of the Indian and the Trapper, all of which are in bronze, were put in position July 24, 1960, the sculptor, Mr. Dallin being present, Hon. Geo. Q. Cannon delivering the address of the day, and Miss Margaret Young, a greatgranddaughter of President Young, unveiling the figures.
