bruised limestone under a few inches of iron ore, the latter bruised to a coarse powder, and subjected to heat long enough to drive off the sulphur, copper and other volatile matter, makes the best filtering material.

Tar soap is healing.

Sedentary persons, especially the dyspeptic and the bilious, might cure themselves, in many cases, by a diet largely of oatmeal and milk, with a cup of hot (not too hot) drink at breakfast and supper, and half a pound of ripe raw truits and melons.

A boy swallowed a cent. He was given the whites of three raw eggs daily, a bread and milk diet, a dose of castor oil each night, and the fourth day the cent was voided.

Carbon c acid gas, which is poisonous, ascends to the top of a room in hot weather, and descends to the bottom in cold weather. So don't sleep on the floor in cold weather.

Wet coal is liable to spontaneous combustion, and when warm gives off carburetted and sulphuretted hydrogen.

Antidote for poison by oak, ivy, etc. Paint the poisoned parts with water in which a handful of quicklime has been dissolved. Three or four applications are sufficient.

Poison from bees, hornets, spiderbites, etc., is instantly arrested by the application of equal parts of common salt and bicarbonate of soda, well rubbed in on the place
