San Francisco, Aug. 18.—The Pacific Mail steamer sailed from this port on Wednesday last, Aug. 16, for the Orient, leaving behind 250 pounds of mail. The steamer will now sail all day except Saturday, when she will be at anchor off the coast of Japan. The packages left behind and returned to the post office 40 packages and 41 sacks were destined for Manila, 29 packages and 30 sacks for Hong Kong, 12 packages for United States, 10 packages for London, 57 sacks for China and Japan, making a total of 51 pouches and 102 sacks. Most of the local registered mail left yesterday. The 130 passengers on were unaccompanied by letter, while 10 were also left behind.

Buenos Ayres, Aug. 18.—The chamber of commerce has called a full for the conversion of the external debt of Argentina.

Forced Daughter to Suicide.

Pasco, Colo., Aug. 18.—Frank Ward, foreman of a sand gang at the Pueblo steel works, has caused the death of his daughter, Frances, aged 16, by forcing her to swallow a quantity of arsenic, and then committing suicide by shooting himself. Neighbors say Ward had been drinking heavily and had threatened to kill himself and the girl. Ward was a widower.

An unfortunate incident occurred prior to adjournment for the day which materially marred the success of the session. After listening to a flood of oratory, the house adjourned after four hours barring interruptions from the resolutions committee which was impatient to get started in its work, the delegates openly rebelled against the further continuation of the program, and a slight war was cast upon two of the speakers, which, though unintended, nevertheless caused some trouble. An adjournment motion was made after Dr. W. H. Smith of San Francisco had concluded his address that the remaining speeches, those of P. J. Van Lobenbels and Benjamin C. Wright of San Francisco, be read by title, placed on the records of the congress and copies furnished to the press. The chairman refused to entertain the motion but the damage had been done and both speakers, attended at the conduct of the congress, declined to speak.

A motion was hurriedly made to adjourn and the session came to an abrupt end.

New Counterfeit \$5 Bill.

Washington, Aug. 18.—Chief Clerk of the Bureau of Engraving and Printing has announced the appearance of a new counterfeit \$5 silver certificate. It is of the series of 1899. Lyons register and Rebers' treasurer is poorly executed and contains two mistakes in the lettering on the face of the note.

Brutally Murdered.

Portland, Ore., Aug. 18.—A special to the Oregonian from Bonneville, Or., says:

While answering his aged mother's call to come home, J. L. Anderson of No. 144 North Franklin street, Kansas City, Mo., was murdered near here this morning. Investigation showed that Anderson had met death by repeated blows on the head and brain, and that he was killed without any motive for the crime nor any clue to the murderer. A letter in his pocket contained an appeal from his mother at Kansas City, Mo., to the police. Anderson was about 27 years of age and though bearing signs of tramping he had been neatly dressed.

Murdered by Tramps.

Augusta, Ga., Aug. 18.—Hattie Hackert, the 10-year-old daughter of Levi J. Hackert, a farmer of Kent's Hill, a village 15 miles northeast of the city, was murdered this morning by a gang of tramps. Four men applied at the house for a meal and while it was being prepared by the daughter, Hackert accompanied the strangers to the stable nearby to do some work. While
