What Prospects.
The public, reviewing the latest
prospects, says: The severe storm
which swept over England last week

in 1879 and 1880, but the allowance
of 100,000,000 bushels for the difference
of 50,000,000 bushels for England and
the Continent seems to be as much as
is warranted thus far in the light
of the latest prospects.
