Abruzzi. The statement was made with the knowledge and consent of Miss Elkins, who desires that it should be given to the public, which has manifested so great an interest in the matter, Senator Elkins arrived in Washing-

Senator Elkins arrived in Washing-ton from his West Virginia home today. He was asked by a representative of the Associated Press if he cared to make any announcement concerning the reported engagement of his daugh-ter. In response he dictated the fol-lowing statement:

ter, in response he dictated the top-lowing statement: "I do not care to say anything further than that my daughter and the Duke of the Abruzzi are not engaged to be married and that I regret exceedingly the annoyance that must have come to the duke and his family by reason of the almost daily discussion of the mat-ter in the press and the constant pub-lication of rumors for so long a time.

While the senator made it clear that Miss Elkins and the duke are not en-Miss Eikins and the duke are not en-gaged, he entertained for the duke the highest regard, as was evidenced by the reply which he made to an inquiry as to how well he was acquainted with the duke.
