

THE PLUM ALLEY AFFAIR.

Taking of Testimony in the Case Against Marshal Parsons.

CHARGED WITH AN OFFENSE CONNECTED WITH GAMBLING.

The Police and their Motives—The Investigation Likely to Develop Some Time.

As stated in yesterday's News, it was on March 1st that a jury had been empaneled in the Third District Court to try the case of the People vs. U. S. Marshal Parsons, against whom the grand jury found an indictment charging him with having continually permitted gaming in a house of which he is part owner, situated to Plum Alley. The time upon which comes the duty of deciding the case is March 11th. H. E. Kellogg, Wm. D. Mitchell, J. A. Cunningham, William Mayne, John Marshall, John T. A. Chouteau, Harry Parsons, J. F. Jennings, J. J. Curran, P. O. Hoffman.

On the resuming of the court at 2:15 after the formal reading of the indictment, charging the defendant with a misdemeanor, testimony was taken on the part of the prosecution as follows:

Assistant District Attorney Stephens then read from the indictment to the court that the marshal was charged with a misdemeanor, that he had "continually permitted gaming in a house of which he is part owner, situated to Plum Alley." Judge Henderson—Well, Mr. Parsons sign any declaration as to the rights of the other parties?

Mr. Parsons—We didn't, that is all we know about it.

Judge Henderson—We want to show that such a declaration was made that Mr. Parsons is all right in his actions, even though he has not signed one. We will have to do that now. It was concluded.

The objection was sustained, and H. E. Kellogg was called. He is a lawyer of this city, and is connected with the building in question on Plum Alley. On March 1st, that evening he entered the office of Mr. Parsons and Dyer. It was about 9:30 in the evening when we called. We entered on the west side of the building and found the entire room in shadow. The lights were all out. There was a keyhole in the door. Mr. Parsons and myself went in and arrested several Chinese men for gambling. The game of two or three Chinese men for Chinese money was played with checks, tokens, pieces of colored paper, and these pieces were used as money.

Mr. Parsons—Yes, they would bring me a lantern.

Mr. Parsons—Did you make any statement to the other parties?

Mr. Parsons—We didn't, that is all we know about it.

Judge Henderson—We want to show that such a declaration was made that Mr. Parsons is all right in his actions, even though he has not signed one. We will have to do that now. It was concluded.

Mr. Parsons—What do you see?

Judge Henderson—We object to that on the ground that it is wholly immaterial. I want to know what there is against the defendant in this case.

Mr. Parsons—We object to that that the defendant is the owner of the building in whole or in part, and if there is anything concerning the connection with it, we want to know that.

Judge Henderson—A lot of people talked in 1900 about the building being a gambling house.

Mr. Parsons—Yes, you, yourself, told me so.

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Judge Henderson—I have been here the past three days April 1st. The building in question is near Commercial street. The interior was the same as when I last left it, except that the lumber had gone, and the walls were still standing.

The witness—Yes, I am a carpenter, and have been working on the building ever since. The evidence is that the building is not good, but it is not bad. It is not good, but it is not bad. The lumber is still standing, and the walls are still standing.

Judge Henderson—Who is your employer? The witness—Mr. Parsons.

The witness—He is my employer. The witness—Yes, he is my employer.
