City Council.

At Monday night's session of the city council the following business was transacted:

Author Beardsley in a communication informed the council that he has been invited to act as general supervisor of the public works of Ogden.

The quarterly reports of auditor and treasurer were referred to the finance committee.

A number of Mount Pleasant citizens requested that their dog tax be remitted, as they had lost all of their police protection.

The recorder was authorized to issue a warrant requiring the sheriff to pay out of interest due on general governmental funds.

Councilman James introduced a resolution regarding the Ogden City streets Railway company. They were asked to withdraw from the city. We will not do so, however, the work to be done within thirty days.

The Order of Railway Commissioners No. 123 petitioned the council to help arbitration in a controversy between a railroad company and a citizen who has made his home in this city on December 1st. Hearings to follow.

The parkmen's ordinance passed its second reading, while the third ordinance went on the table indefinitely.

The paving committee was not ready to give a report, and a recess of fifteen minutes was taken to expedite their work in "paving the matter over." At the expiration of the recess, the committee again voted to postpone its resolution to report. However, the said report was not as unanimous as it might have been, nevertheless, the "paving" ordinance was passed.

On a vote of seven to two the superintendents were elected and Beardsley was authorized to draw a warrant of \$5,000.00, the balance due Morris, Mason & Witterson, the paving contractors.

A large number of bills were ordered paid and others adjourned.

Court Proceedings.

On Monday the board of county commissioners met in regular session, all were present and the following business was transacted:

Leyce Barker and forty others asked that an application be made to the postmaster at the Marlboro road, Ogden, to ascertain if the same is being maintained.

J. B. McFarlane and others petitioned the county court for a small appropriation for the repair of the long-drawn highway east, Richfield.

The matter of remitting the taxes of S. F. Parker as petitioned by Gile A. Craig was referred to Judge Blom.

An application was made by James H. Russell to lease forty acres of land in Ogden.

An application was referred to the amount of \$500.00 was allowed.

The annual report of Preston Blunt, road supervisor of Marquette, was approved.

An appropriation of \$200.00 was made for repair and improvement of roads in Marquette. One hundred and fifty dollars was appropriated for improvement of roads in Salt Creek district. Two hundred dollars was appropriated for improving Marquette.

A recovery was ordered of the road leading from Ogden to Helper.

O. H. Blumkamp was appointed road supervisor of Pleasant View, and court adjourned for one week.

Fourth District Court.
