Clark, County Auditor, do hereby give public notice that no listed named persons are delinquent in the payment of state, School, County, County School, City and City School taxes for the year 1896, and that the amount of taxes due from each is the amount indicated thereon, less amounts indicated, reference being hereby made to the duplicate assessment rolls of county, now in legal custody, for the names and amounts due under the laws, and the delinquent taxes herein indicated are hereby made a part of this notice. Unless and amounts indicated with the taxes named, are never paid by December 1st, 1897, such as are on the project, the highest responsible bidder for said, or otherwise prescribed by law, Said sale will begin at the first Monday of December, 1897, at 12 o'clock noon, at the Salt Lake County Building, Salt Lake City, Utah, and continue from day to day, until the property or delinquency is exhausted, or the taxes and costs paid.
