Arming the Navy.

Commodore Montgomery Seward,

Chief of the Bureau of Ordnance, in his

annual report to the Secretary of the

Navy, says that during the year the num-

ber of six-inch high power steel guns

have been finished and fired at the na-

tal ordnance proving grounds, and that

they have all given proof of a very satis-

factory character and 2,000 muzzle vel-

ocities were obtained with standard pow-

er and projectiles and moderate chamber

pressures. The work on the smaller

guns and gunnery is progressing satis-

factorily. Under the head of projectiles,

Commodore Seward says that the

character of the projectiles is of an

unusually high character of cast iron as

a material for the projectiles intended to

be used in high power guns, and the

failure of the steel makers to supply

unannealed cast steel bullets of good

quality.

Under the head of machines, guns

and cannon, the report notes the ten-

dency abroad to increase the caliber of

such cannon, and the opinion is ex-

pressed that the caliber of the new pro-

jects of twenty and thirty pound guns

will be increased to 10 and 12 inches

respectively. Cartridges for the new

guns have been produced in this coun-

try which perform better than those

abroad.

Touching the armament of new ves-

sels Commander Seward says: "The

new ships approaching completion

will be armed with 10-inch and 12-

inch guns, and three six-inch and five

inch guns. All the guns of the second

class will be 10-inch and 12-inch

guns. The equipment of the new ships

will be a great improvement. The

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ment. The equipment of the new ships
