#### GREAT BRITAIN.

Cholera Decranging on the Continent.

LONDON, 7.—The cholera epidemic in the Baltic provinces begins to abate.

FRANCE.

Venice.

PARIS, 6.—Chevalier Negre is said to be in full accord with Napoleon to represent Italy.

Bazaine attributes the failure at Metz mainly to lack of ammunition.

Italian officers are studying strategical points of French territory, in view of possible war with France.

The League for the delivery of Alsace and Lorraine will continue its labors, but has modified its title to the society for the promotion of Alsatian emigration.

The Assembly has adopted the bill laying the burden of the losses by war on the whole nation, and providing for the immediate distribution of 10,000,000 francs among the sufferers by the common insurrection.

The negotiations for the evacuation of French territory by the German troops are not progressing smoothly.

GERMANY.

Imperial Banquet.

SALZBURG, 6.—The Emperor of Germany, accompanied by Prince Bismarck, arrived to-night and was received by the Emperor of Austria, who was attended by a brilliant suite of sovereigns. The Emperor is to be a grand banquette to-night, in which the Imperial Majesties and distinguished statesmen of both Empires will be present.

The Inability Decree.

BERLIN, 6.—The North German Bishops have just concluded their conference at Potsdam to consider the question of the decree of inability. At the meetings it has been decided to omit the customary morning cathedral high mass. From the earnest manner in which they have commenced to conduct their meetings it is evident that they mean business.

PERSIA.

The Famine Subduing.

From Shiraz, June 21. The report is that the famine in Persia had almost come to an end, but the distress caused by it would continue for a long time.

The price of bread had fallen considerably, but all the property of the poorer classes, excepting only the most necessary clothes, had long since been sold or exchanged for bread, and it was but too evident that starvation would be the fate of a great many more. On the road from Shiraz to Kerman, Shiraz is about as many places half of the interred bodies. At the caravan way, about 30 miles from Shiraz, it is stated that 200 died of starvation in a week. Karzoon, a town eighty miles from Shiraz, is half depopulated. The inhabitants went to Shiraz, Bushir, or other large towns. A great number died on the roads and crowds began in the last stages of decay, often resulting in loss of life, took place over the carcasses of mules, donkeys, or horses which had died on the road. Robberies with violence were frequent. At Yezd and Kerman the famine raged, more than anywhere else. Eighty cases where children had been killed and devoured by parents were reported.
