At the same time we cling to this wholesome rule—that an edi-tor who libels a citizen should be punished; that when he outrages the law he should be subject to its penalties, and that there is no cant more pernicious and absurd than what we constantly hear about the 'fiberty of the press.' The press does not want 'liberty,' but justice, and editors who ask for any special privileges or immunities are simply
