WASHINGTON, 14.—Hazen, Third As-  
 sistant Postmaster General has com-  
 pleted a statement based upon the re-  
 turns of 140 post offices for the year  
 return one-half the postal revenue,  
 whereas the law requires \$5,000,570.  
 This is a falling off in receipts com-  
 pared with the corresponding quarter  
 of the previous year, of \$183,840 or 3-10  
 per cent. As the reduction in postage  
 went into effect this winter, the re-  
 turns were awaited with some an-  
 ticipation by the postal officials, who  
 are in accord with the law to the  
 effect of the reduced rate upon the  
 revenues of the Department. A loss  
 of \$100,000 is estimated. The returns
