Wants to Answer to Roll Call on Monday Morning.

Senator Kearns leaves for Washington this evening to respond "Here, sir," at Monday morning's roll call in the United States Senate. He has had a very busy time of it during the few days he has been at home, but has hardly time to eat or sleep, both of which in fact he has done "in spots."

His office was in a state of sleep all the time he was there, and but for Cerebus Wescott, who guarded the inner door with zealous care, the Senator would have been bogged with callers of all kinds regardless of "age, sex, color, or previous condition of servitude." In fact the Senator was seriously thinking of having private stairs built at the rear of his private office in order to escape from importunate callers.

Senator Kearns received a delegation of citizens from Sanpete county, accompanied by State Engineer Doremus, to discuss the water shed problem. The visitors were Parley Christensen of Mayfield, Bishop Jensen of Salina, Henry Kearns and Reuben Christensen of Cannonville, John H. White of Salt Lake was also present. Mr. Doremus said something must be done to protect the watersheds of the state from destruction. Sheep and cattle have been allowed to range through them indiscriminately and the result has been the packing of the ground to such a degree of hardness that the water runs off as fast as it falls. Much of the under brush which holds the snow and water has also disappeared.

The state engineer suggested it might be wise for Congress to cede the watersheds of various counties through out the state to those communities to be held forever in trust for the public good. This would have to be done or forest reserves created. Mr. Christensen and Bishop Jensen favored this.

Senator Kearns could make at present no definite promises, stating that he desired further time to look into the matter. He had received petitions favoring the establishment of forest reserves and petitions asking for community control.
