

## AN ULTIMATUM TO E. H. HARRIMAN

Grand Master Hannahan of Locomotive Firemen Gives Him  
A Warning.

DRASTIC MEASURES COMING.

Awaits an Immediate Answer—Not  
Received Will Feel Has Ex-  
ercised Due Patience.

Peoria, Ill., Jan. 1.—Grand Master Hannahan of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Enginemen, tonight issued a second ultimatum to E. H. Harriman of the Southern Pacific railroad, warning him of the impending drastic measures that will be placed in effect unless he exercises his powers to terminate the grievances now prevailing. The telegram follows:

"Peoria, Ill., Jan. 1.—E. H. Harriman, president Southern Pacific, New York. 'The dispute on the Atlantic system of the Southern Pacific company, notwithstanding statements to the contrary, is between your company and our members. On other of your lines the feeling is growing that they may expect the same injustice in the near future. If your representatives really desire arbitration, we are anxious to adjust in that way, and we insist that a third party should not be permitted to influence your company in this matter. Once more, in justice to the men and the public, who will be affected by an extension of a strike to other parts of your system, I ask you to exercise your authority and restore the conditions which the abrogation of the agreement took away from the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen on May 1. Your officials entered willingly into an agreement with the Brotherhood of Enginemen that nullified the same. 'I await an immediate answer. Not hearing from you, I shall feel that I have exercised due patience and have served a final notice to the public. 'I. J. HANNAHAN, Grand Master, Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Enginemen.'"

The grand executive board of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Enginemen held an all-day session today with Grand Master Hannahan, and matters pertaining to the strike on the Southern Pacific system were considered. An adjournment was taken late in the afternoon until tomorrow, when additional matters will come up for consideration. Nothing was made public, save the bare announcement that the board was in session. Grand Master Hannahan declined to make a statement.

## ARCHBISHOP RYAN ARRAIGNED FRENCH GOVERNMENT.

Philadelphia, Jan. 1.—Today's New Year reception to Archbishop Ryan was made notable by a scathing arraignment by the archbishop of the French government's treatment of the Catholic church, denouncing the officials of the present government as infidels, whom he considered worse than pagans. The archbishop expressed the hope that the religious awakening in France would soon overthrow the oppressors of the Christian religion. He said:

"The infidels are worse than pagans. The pagans believe in God and in a hereafter, where the good are rewarded, but the infidel does not. Pagans have some virtues mixed with their vices, but the modern infidel has all the vices without any of the redeeming virtues of a pagan."

## RUSSIAN MURDER MYSTERY.

After Months That of Deputy Hertzstein Has Been Cleared Up.

St. Petersburg, Jan. 1.—The mystery surrounding the murder of former Deputy Hertzstein has, after months of investigation, finally been unraveled. Hertzstein, who was a member of the lower house of parliament from Moscow, was murdered at his country house near Terol, Finland, on July 11, 1906. A secret committee of the Constitutional Democratic party traced the entire conspiracy and has obtained definite proof that the deed was the work of the League of Russian People. A man named Muskevitch is a prominent leader of this league and it is alleged he hired the assassins to kill Hertzstein. The proofs have been placed in the hands of the public prosecutor and an effort is being made to bring the case to trial.

## WALL FELL.

Killed One Man, Hurt Two Others,  
One Fatally.

San Francisco, Jan. 1.—A wall of masonry, which fell shortly before noon today, killed one man, mangled another so badly that he will probably die, and seriously injured a third. Another man, working directly underneath the falling mass of debris, who was thought for several hours to be buried beneath the pile, had a narrow escape, stepping out of the path of death by a fraction of a second.

The accident occurred in the ruins of the old California Can company's building at Seventh and Townsend streets. The laborers were engaged in tearing down the wall, which was a well about 12 feet high, and had undermined it in the center preparatory to pulling it down with ropes.

While the men were working beneath the tottering ruins a passenger train of the Southern Pacific company thundered by, and the slight shock caused the walls to crash down without warning. Bystanders began digging frantically to unearth the two buried men, and succeeded in taking two of them out of the pile alive. One, a third man, who was caught by the avalanche of bricks, was dead when the rescuers reached his body.

## HUSBAND KILLS MASHER.

## HARRIMAN SUMMONED BEFORE COMMISSION.

New York, Jan. 2.—E. H. Harriman, president of the Union Pacific, Southern Pacific and other lines in the Union Pacific system and many members of his official staff have been summoned to testify before the interstate commerce commission at sessions which will begin here Friday. Mr. Harriman will be present at the opening of the investigation, his health, permitting, but it is not probable that he will be called to testify at the first day's session.

Arrangements for the appearance of chief officers of the system have been made by Frank B. Kellogg and C. A. Severance of St. Paul. Others than Mr. Harriman who have been notified to appear are A. L. Mohler, vice president and general manager of the Union Pacific; J. C. Stubbs, traffic director; William Mahl, comptroller; Alexander Millard secretary; V. S. Thorne, director of purchases and Julius Kruttschnitt, who probably be the first witness. The investigation, it is believed, will last for many weeks.

## PROF. ALBERT BERG DYING.

New York, Jan. 2.—Prof. Albert Wilhelm Berg, for 30 years organist at the "Little Church Around the Corner," is dying at his home in this city. For a month he has been suffering from heart disease and dropsy and his burden of 81 years was against him. On June 29, 1903, he and his wife celebrated their golden wedding. Prof. Berg was for years a voluminous composer of church music.

## GOV. MAGOON'S RECEPTION.

Holds New Year's One in Red Room  
Of Palace at Havana.

Havana, Jan. 1.—Gov. Magoon held his New Year reception in the red room of the palace today. Among those who came to express their good wishes were the members of the diplomatic and consular corps, senators, members of the house of representatives, the justices of the supreme court, the chief of departments and officers of the army and navy. Senor Gaytan de Aya, the Spanish minister and dean of the diplomatic corps, addressing Mr. Magoon as the representative of the Cuban republic, extended the congratulations of the corps and expressed their earnest wishes for the speedy and complete re-establishment of the normal political status of Cuba on the basis of the restoration of Cuban independence. In conclusion the Spanish minister extended to Gov. Magoon personally the earnest wishes of his colleagues for his complete success in the noble task in which he is engaged.

In reply Gov. Magoon expressed his profound gratitude at these assurances of friendship.

"I join you in wishing," the governor continued, "the early and complete re-establishment of political tranquility in Cuba. The sympathy of the world is supporting the United States and directly assisting it, and there is little doubt that the remaining difficulties will soon be removed."

Gen. Franklin Bell has turned over the command of the American forces in Cuba to Brig. Gen. T. J. Wint. Accompanied by his wife and Gen. Ridgely, commander of the Cuban rural guards, Gen. Bell left here this afternoon on the steamer Olivette for Tampa.

## A HUSBAND'S REVENGE.

Joplin, Mo., Jan. 1.—At the boarding house where he lived, F. W. Troy today shot his wife, Patosia, aged 39, through the head and breast, and shot Ralph Quinn, aged 24, son of the landlady, through the shoulder. Mrs. Troy probably will die. Quinn will recover. Troy was captured and taken to Carthage for questioning. He refused to discuss the shooting.

## APPEAL TO PRESIDENT.

Is Asked to Appoint a Receiver for the  
Rock Island Road.

Guthrie, Okla., Jan. 1.—A large number of millmen, grain, lumber, cotton and coal dealers in Oklahoma today sent to President Roosevelt a petition, asking that a receiver be appointed for the Rock Island railroad, alleging inability on the part of the corporation to properly handle the freight and passenger business offered to it for transportation.

The petition is the direct outcome of the car shortage, from which the interests represented by the signers of the petition are still suffering. The petition cites that the Rock Island is unable to handle but a small part of public traffic.

## HOME BURNED.

Three Little Children Perished in the  
Flames.

Redding, Cal., Jan. 1.—Twin boys aged 3 years, and their 1-year-old widow, the children of Mrs. Stewart, a widow living near Anderson, were

burned to death this afternoon, when their home was destroyed by fire. The mother was visiting at the house of neighbors at the time, and attempted suicide when she learned of the fate of her children. The three children, it is supposed, from the position of the charred bodies were asleep in one bed where their mother had put them. The origin of the fire is a mystery.

## OLD CUSTOM ABOLISHED.

New Orleans, Jan. 1.—La gnppe, one of the oldest customs distinctive to New Orleans, was abolished today by concerted action of the trades people, especially grocers, at the request of the board of health. La gnppe is a survival of the Spanish settlers, who preceded the French in Louisiana, and consists in giving to purchasers small favors, such as an apple or piece of candy. The board of health stopped it because of the rotten edibles given to children.

## EIGHT PEOPLE HURT. TWENTY-FOUR SHAKEN UP.

Lexington, Ky., Jan. 1.—Eight people were seriously injured and 24 others badly shaken up in a wreck on the Louisville & Atlantic railway, 40 miles from Richmond, Ky., today. The most seriously injured are: Albert Wilson, his two sons, Edward and Siohsey, the wife and child of Edward Wilson, all of this city, and three passengers whose names are unknown. The baby's hand was buried completely off. Mrs. Wilson was buried severely about the body. The wreck was caused by a broken flange on the pony trucks of the engine. The engine and one coach jumped the track, turning completely over. The injured are at the Richmond hospital.

## GREAT BIRTH RATE.

New York, Jan. 1.—The birth, marriage and death statistics of New York City for 1906, were made public today with the comment that it was a prosperous 12 months. During 1906, there were reported 111,177 births, an increase over 1905 of 8,000; 43,355 marriages, an increase of 5,700; 76,206 deaths, an increase of 2,492. The birth record is the greatest ever reported.

## CARELESS FIREMEN

Responsible for Serious Injury of Five  
Persons.

Chicago, Jan. 2.—Carelessness of firemen in erecting a ladder at a fire which partly destroyed the residence of Dr. P. H. Welch, 608 North State street, yesterday, was responsible for serious injury to five persons, two of whom were firemen, one woman whom the firemen were endeavoring to rescue, the fourth a small boy who stood watching the fire and the fifth a passing man.

In their haste to raise the ladder to the third story of the house and rescue Mrs. C. H. Cooke, 60 years of age, mother of Mrs. Welch, the firemen neglected properly to connect it in the middle and it collapsed under the weight of the two men and the woman, precipitating all three to the pavement. The end of the ladder as it fell struck the boy on the head, causing a fracture of the skull.

The fire started in the basement from an overheated furnace and gained strong headway before it was discovered. Ten members of Dr. Welch's household, including Dr. and Mrs. Welch, their six children, the nurse, Miss Nellie Corlett, and Mrs. Crooke, were on the second and third floors.

The nurse distinguished herself as the heroine of the day by rescuing the two younger children from suffocation on the third floor after all other residents of the house had escaped. Dr. Welch, Mrs. Cooke and the nurse escaped by the means of ladders placed barely in time by the firemen. The loss amounts to \$25,000.

## GEN. BOOTH'S TOUR.

He Will Start on One of the World  
About Middle of February.

London, Jan. 2.—Gen. Booth, head of the Salvation army, will start about the middle of February on his tour of the world. He will go to New York, thence to Canada and will embark from Seattle for Japan on April 2. The remainder of his itinerary has not yet been planned. Gen. Booth says it is the last trip of the kind he will make.
