Was down to St. George Temple last spring, and performed a good work for his dead.

On Sunday, the 3rd August, he was conveyed from his residence to the tabernacle by the members of the High Council, and Battalion boys as pall bearers. After singing, etc., many of his old friends spoke of his past life in a very praiseworthy manner; a great many followed him to his last resting place.
