ANTI-TUBERCULOSIS LEAGUE.

Atlanta, Ga., Dec. 2 .--- The American Anti-Tuberculosis league, under the presidency of Dr. George Brown, of Atlanta, is planning for the intro-duction in the legislature in every state in the union bills to secure uniform legislation for the care of indigent consumptives and to prevent the spread of the disease. This plan will be laid before the next meeting of the league at Atlantic City, in June, 1907. The co-operation of government officials, national, state and municipal, is to be asked to forward the measure.

A. R. SIBLEY CAPTURED.

Man Accused of Three Murders Believed to be Mortally Wounded.

El Paso, Tex., Dec. 2.—After a des-perate fight with officers, during which he was shot several times, A. R. Sib-ley, the sheepbuyer who is alleged to have murdered and robbed B. M. Caw-thorn and J. W. Ralston and another valuer on three successive days, in Valverde county, was captured last night in the mountains near Sander-son, and is now in jail, belleved to be mortally wounded. The circumstances attending the three

In each case Sibley pur-chased large herds from his alleged vic-tim, the rancher delivering the stock at Del Rio, receiving a check, which he promptly cashed, and later being found murdered and pobled.

This prisoner, after hearing of the Coepenick affair, informed the police of Volgt's remarks, which fastened suspicion upon the latter. Volgt was sentenced to four years' imprisonment and costs.

MUTUAL LIFE AGENT.

Noam Jasogrodsky Committed to Jail

Without Bail. New York, Dec. 2 .- Noam Jasogrodsky, who represented himself to be a former agent of the Mutual Life Insur-

sky, who represented himself to be a former agent of the Mutual Life Insur-ance company, recently engaged as a chess expert and teacher and a Wall street agent for mining stock, was ar-raigned today and committed to the Tombs without ball for 48 hours to await the outcome of extradition pro-ceedings. He is wanted in Michigan in connection with a transaction by which he is alleged to have received \$10,000 from M. Simblier of Bay City, to cover wedding expenses, and failed to return the same. Jasogrodsky ad-mitted the transaction, which he said was of the type known as an "ex-change of notes," and said that pay-ment had been heid up on account of a dispute over the interest payemnts. The obligation was incurred, he said, just prior to his marriage last April to a daughter of the late Rabbi Wolf Landau of Bay City. He denounced his arrest as an out-rage and the result of a conspiracy. In court he said he had been for some time Mutuaj Life Insurance company
