Arrival of the Biffemen. DUBLIN, 15.—The American team arrived here this evening.

The American riflemen, accompanied by Major Leech and Alderman Manning, of Dublin, and a large number of friends, left Cork on a special train for this city; they were greeted with chears at the various stations ex routs. The Lord Mayor and members of the corpetation of the city of Dublin received them at the depot here, and conducted them to their carriages. A procession was then formed, with a band at the head, and escorted the guests through Sackville, Dawson and other principal streets to the Sherbourne hotel. The reception given the team by the populace was most enthusiastic. There were immense crowds at the depot and along the entire routs. The railway station and streets were decorated, the American and Irish flage being everywhere displayed. The enthusiasm culminated at the hotel, where each member of the team was cheered as he alighted frem his carriage, and people pressed forward to shake hands with them, and shouts of welcome were heard everywhere. Thousands of spectators remained in front of the hotel until a late hour at night. During the evening a procession, with bands of mustic and carrying
