BRIEF TELEGRAMS.

President Arthur leaves New York for Newport next Tuesday.

The London *Pall Mall Gazette* condemns the action passed on Gray.

Nathaniel J. Merriman, bishop of Grahamstown, South Africa, is dead.

The Treasurer yesterday purchased 615,000 ounces of fine silver for delivery at the mint.

A Japanese military officer in the Korean service is among the killed in the Korean revolution.

A carrier plough from Detroit to Philadelphia, in less than five hours, yesterday.

Lyon Playfair, member of Parliament for Edinburgh, sailed last night for the United States.

The Berlin branch of the bi-metallic association has called a congress to meet at Cologne, Germany, Oct. 12th.

The palace of Count Andran, at Vienna, was robbed of all the count's orders and many articles of art and antiquity.

Penniman & Brother, importers of hardware, one of the largest houses in their line in Baltimore, made an assignment yesterday.

Potter and Scott, two colored men fought according to the Marquess of Queensbury rules, at Celestine, Ohio, yesterday. The former knocked his antagonist out of time in the fourth round.

In New York, the Executive Committee of the Anti-Monopoly League has issued a call for a State convention, to be held at Saratoga, September 13th.

The United States steamship *Adams* now at San Francisco, has been ordered to go to Alaska, with the *Wachusett* now at that station. The *Wachusett* will proceed to San Francisco.

At Yankton, D. T., W. D. Russell was convicted, in the United States Court, of complicity in the Santa Fe scrip fraud, and was sentenced to imprisonment for one year.

At Amsterdam, N. Y., last night five masked men bound William Gilman and his wife, and carried them to a house in the city. They got \$500 in money and \$150,000 worth of bonds and mortgages. No arrests.

In New York, Gen. Sickles' half brother, during the absence of the General, robbed the house of the General's wife, and carried off all the General's property. The General is on a visit to Grand Rapids, Michigan.

In Hoboken, N. J., William A. Lee, aged 79, was committed to-day as a vagrant. In jail at the Dublin residence. He was the Dublin correspondent of the *Belfast Examiner*, and was compelled to fly his country in 1881.

In the bankers' convention all of last year's officers were re-elected. A. H. Hopkins was re-elected on savings banks, and W. B. Williams followed on the same subject. All other papers on the programme were concisely and ably adjourned.

MEETINGS AT BEAR LAKE.

PARIS, August 14th, 1882.

Editor *Deseret News*:

It was President Taylor's intention, after attending the Logan Conference, to have visited Bear Lake State, but business of importance requiring his attention, he returned to Salt Lake with some of the early arrivals. Mr. Taylor and Sup't. O'Connell, of Logan, came on to Meadowville, where they were met by President Budge and party from Paris on Tuesday, the 8th inst. Meeting was held in Meadowville the same evening, and the next day the whole party came to Garden City, where a meeting was held. Then they proceeded to Fish Lake for dinner and held meeting there at 2 p. m. They next moved on to St. Charles, where Apostle Lyman and some party remained last night, and at 10 a. m. next morning held a meeting, and proceeded to Paris in the evening. On Friday the brethren held a morning meeting at Cedar Grove, and at 2 p. m. at 2 p. m. On Thursday evening President Taylor's sons—William W. and John W.—arrived here from Salt Lake and held a meeting at 8 p. m. On Saturday the Quarterly Conference convened under the auspices of the Public Square here. The morning meeting was occupied by President William Budge, who spoke of the good condition of the people in this State, and the prosperity attending their labors. The reports were given, substantiating the declarations of President Budge.

Ed John W. Taylor delivered a discourse upon the fulfillment of prophecy and the assurance we have that the prophecies of the servants of God are fulfilled will be confirmed.

At 3 p. m. after the reading of the statistical report, the Conference was addressed by President Joseph E. Noble and W. W. Taylor and Apostle Lyman, who pointed out the duties of the Saints and the Priesthood in a very effective manner. Sup't. O'Connell and W. W. Taylor made remarks in reference to Temple building.

After this meeting Apostle Lyman and party left for the Utah Valley, High Councilors, Bishops and Counselors of the State. There was a full attendance, and very much valuable instruction in reference to the affairs of the State and the duties of the Saints.
