A PROMINENT PEDAGOGUE.

President of the United Educational Association Visiting the Schools of Salt Lake.

In company with Dr. Millington, Hon. Charles H. Skinner, superintendent of public instruction of the state of New York and President of the United Educational Association, which is to be held in this city, arrived here yesterday afternoon from Los Angeles, where he attended the California State Teachers' Association early in the present month. He is accompanied by his wife and will remain here during his journey to the east.

Mr. Skinner is well known in the educational work of the country. Not only in that line, he engaged in the newspaper business for several years, and from 1861 to 1883 represented the Salt Lake district of his state in the house of Congress. At the expiration of his last congressional term he came deputy state superintendent of public instruction for New York and two years ago was chosen superintendent.

The Company Wins.

Judgment was rendered for the defendant, his heirs holding that there was no cause of action.

CUSTOMS OF YUKON INDIANS.

MANY OF THEM PURPOSELY STARVED TO DEATH—MURDER, BUT MORAL AND HONOR.

There were formerly many curious customs of the Eskimo and other tribes that prevailed among the tribes inhabiting the upper Yukon country. Perhaps the most barbaric of all was in the treatment of the female infants. Just after the birth of a child she is entrusted to some one of the opposite sex, and advanced age, who is selected by her or her future wife. During the time before arriving at that age when she becomes a wife, her male guardian, for such he is, is supposed to contribute a certain portion of the spoils of the chase to her support. If, before she arrives at that age, she dies, her husband, or as it were, her guardian, is supposed to be a failure and is starved to death. Should a man be born and an infant wants to be buried, he is taken to his future wife, then she is not allowed to live. All the male infants are, however, brought up, as they will make good hunters. Consequently, it is estimated that for every female there are a hundred males.

Curious as it may seem, the two sexes live separate and distinct portions of the time. Both men and women dress alike, and are unacquainted to them as such. They distinguish one from the other unless very close. During the winter these people travel together with dogs and sleds, and in the summer they convert their dogs and even their reindeer into pack animals, and it is a curious sight to see a long pack train of dogs loaded with reindeer of thirty pounds each, and the line broken here and there with a human being, laboring under the weight of a hundred pounds. Their canoes are very primitive in size and of an inferior construction, and it is an impossibility to be on the water without being in it in the winter without upsetting. They are built to hold but one person, and are so constructed that they can be easily carried under a canoe to occupy the least space possible.

These Indians are very moral in their habits and strictly honest. They are hungry and make a meal of whatever, be it human or animal. But they do not eat of the things that are in the skin for what food he appropriates to his own use—Alaska News.
