

publican, has 7,152; Rosecrans, dem 7,736; Maybell, greenback, 247.

New York.—The apparent republican defeat in New Jersey is attributed to the Pennsylvania R. R., which threw its great power against them because Potts, rep. candidate for Governor had identified himself with their Central road.

The latest returns from New York for the mayoralty give Grace, "democrat, 98,051; Dowd, republican, 96,748. Fifteen election districts are missing.

Connecticut is about 3,000 republican.

Denver, Col., 3.—Forty-nine towns and precincts covering about half of the State, give Garfield 2,840 majority. The balance of the State will probably increase these figures.

Chicago, 3.—Returns have been received from half of the State of Illinois, but the comparison has only been made with 297 towns and precincts outside of Chicago. This shows a net republican gain of 2,385. At the same rate for the rest of the State the plurality in the State for Garfield will be about 44,000. The vote on governor and congressmen is little less. The secretaryship does not seem to have been very pronounced in any section. The republicans certainly gain one congressman.

Trenton, N. J.—Returns are so incomplete that it is impossible to give Hancock's majority in this State, but it will undoubtedly reach 5,000.

St. Louis, Mo.—Almost complete returns give Hancock a plurality of 433, Crittenden, democrat, for Governor, a plurality of 514, and the remainder of the State ticket pluralities ranging from 28 to 748, excepting for Secretary of State, Broadwell, republican, for that office, receiving a plurality of 632. The city part of the first congressional gives Fletcher, republican, about 1,800. Five counties outside of the city belonging to this district, will probably give Clardy, democrat, a majority, which will elect him by perhaps 2,500 majority. The second district gives Thomas Allen, democrat, between 2,500 and 3,000 majority. The third district is very close and will probably require the official vote to settle it.

Des Moines, Ia.—Garfield's plurality in Iowa is about 83,392.

Nashville, Tenn.—The vote between Hawkins, republican, and Wright, funder democrat, is very close for Governor, with the chances in favor of the former. As the republicans elected a member of the legislature in Shelby and Davidson Counties, it is thought they will control the legislature, and thus secure a United States Senator and the State officers.

Hartford, Conn.—With five towns to hear from the State gives Garfield 65,745; Hancock 62,879; Weaver 769; Dow 333; total vote 129,727. Garfield's plurality 2,867. Majority over all 1,765. For Governor, Bigelow, republican, has 64,833; English, democrat, 62,157; scattering 1,044; Biglow 1,682 majority. The legislature is estimated at 73 republican majority. Buck, republican, in the first district, 1,998 plurality; Philips, democrat, second district, 1,984 plurality; Waite, republican, third district 2,666 plurality; Miles, republican, fourth district, 677 plurality.

Boston.—The gubernatorial vote with 28 towns counted is large; rep., 150,616; Thompson, dem., 104,064; Sargent, 3,801; Almy, 672.

Philadelphia.—Garfield's majority in 61 out of the 67 counties is 25,899. Five of the remaining counties gave 3,151 majority for Hayes in 76, and the 6th Lackawanna was not then in existence. Garfield's majority in the State will be about 30,000. The total vote in Philadelphia was Garfield, 98,794; Hancock, 78,067; Weaver, 261; Dow, 45. Republican plurality, 20,727. For auditor general, Lutton, rep., gets 18,257 plurality; for judge of the Supreme Court, Green, rep., gets 22,243 plurality. The republican city ticket is elected by at least 20,000 majority; except Jeffries for controller, who is defeated by Pattison, dem., by 13,000 majority.

New York.—The city elects to the assembly 18 democrats and six representatives. Late returns show the vote on the mayoralty to be—Grace, democrat, 98,051; Dowd, republican, 96,748. Grace's majority 1,303. Forty-five election districts are missing. The vote for register is—Docharty, democrat, 101,244; Hess, republican, 93,524. Docharty's majority is 7,720; fifteen election districts are missing. It was expected the republicans might capture these two offices.

Cincinnati.—The Enquirer, (dem) says: It appears that Grant, Conk-

ling, Cameron and Logan have been elected. It appears the effect of the October elections was too patent to overcome. It is not the triumph of Garfield, it is the victory of the strong who came to his rescue in Ohio and Indiana before the 12th of October and in whose hands he is.

Returns from the various States indicate that Garfield and Arthur are elected beyond doubt. The republicans gain in every northern State except New Jersey, from which the returns are as yet very incomplete.

Chicago.—Mayor Harrison's plan to allow voters the privilege of depositing their ballots after the close of the polls, did not succeed, as only 37 votes were deposited in one of the boxes.

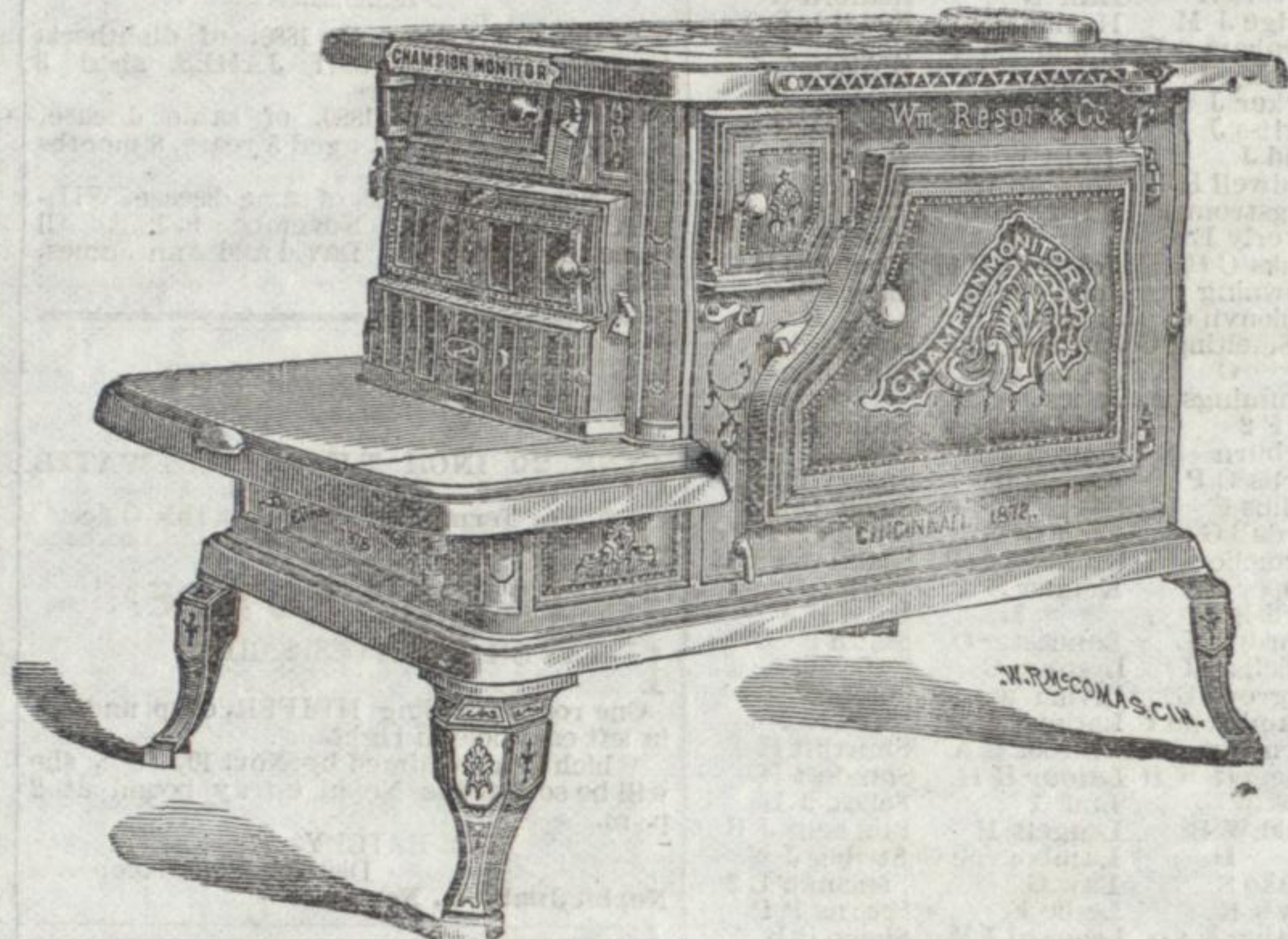
