### Murdered Man Robbed.

Dallas, Tex., Dec. 2.-It developed to-day that when killed in Dallas last Mon-day night Charles Goldstein had on his person deeds to Alaska mining property valued at 8150,000. The deeds are missing. Mr. Goldstein brought the deeds to Dallas from Alaska to negotiate a lower rate of interest on a financial obligation. It is known that the documents were in his pocket Monday night shortly before his body was found.

### England Won't Interfere.

London, Dec. 9,-In response to the ap-peal of the international arbitration so-slety, Foreign Minister Lanadowne ap-nounces that the government is not aware of any circumstances that would justify them in modifying their previous decision not to interfere with the present Russo-Jananese war. Japanese war.

### Diplomats' Salaries.

Washington, Dec. 9.-In the estimates for the diplomatic and consular service forwarded to Congress by Secy, Hay rec-ommendations are made for increases in the salaries of a large number of officers in the service. It is recommended that the salary of the minister to Argentine be increased \$2,000; that of minister resident to Liberia, \$3,500, and that provision be made for a minister to Roumania and Servia, and one for Greece and Monte-negro, and for a consular agent in Bui-garia. 1.685

He also claimed the law fixed his day at eight hours. Under civ-Il service rules, he could not be dis-charged except under charges which had been proved.

GARDNER FOUND GUILTY.

Jury Concludes That He Illegally Sold Firewater to Indians.

Arguments in the case of the United States against John A. Gardner, under indictment for selling liquor to Indiana on three counts, were concluded before Judge Marshall yesterday in the federal court, at 4:30 o'clock. After an hour's deliberation the jury returned a verdict of guilty on the second count and not guilty on the first and third.
