## LOCAL AND OTHER MATTERS.

**THEATRICAL.**—The "Lancashire Lass" will be presented this evening for the last time. This great sensational drama should attract a crowded house.

On Monday next Mr. McCallister will take his benefit, when he will present himself in his great character of "Artagnan" in the famous play of "The Three Musketeers," which will be produced with fine scenery and a great cast. "The Three Musketeers" is a splendid exciting drama, and as the house will be crowded, seats should be secured early. There is great scope for acting in this excellent drama. **NOT YET HEARD FROM.**—The young man, George Marchbanks, afflicted with fits, and partially imbecile, who strayed from his father's house in the 12th Ward, on Monday last, has not yet been discovered. The last known of him, is that he went into the 11th Ward on Monday evening, which he left after having sat awhile and warmed himself. His parents are filled with the deepest anxiety on his account, fearing that, having lost his way, he may have sat down and been frozen to death, or have come to some other untimely death. He is eighteen years of age and about five feet four inches high. If any person in the city or country have seen or heard anything of him, or have him in safekeeping and will take him to the City Hall, or send tidings of him there or to this office, they will do a very great kindness to his sorrowing parents.

**YOUTHFUL INCENDIARY.**—The Territorial Enterprise, of the 10th inst. says:

Day before yesterday Deputy Chief of Police Hall took charge of a boy about six years of age and shut him up in a cell in the station house for safe keeping until it can be decided what can be done with him. The boy, whose name is Jacobs, and whose parents reside in the city, has a perfect mania for setting fire to buildings, and child as he is, has for some time been the terror of the neighborhood in which he lives. The day before yesterday he set fire to several tons of hay stacked in the rear of Mooney's livery stable, B street, and but for some older boys running to the spot and beating the fire out there would soon have been a large and destructive fire. He has three times kindled fires under and against the residence of Mr. E. H. H. Oldfield, on South A street, once or twice set fire to the dwelling of Mr. McKay, in the same vicinity, and kindled numerous fires in dangerous places. His parents find it impossible to break him of his incendiary mania, and are at a loss what to do with him. Young as he is, he is very cunning, and however closely watched manages in some way to steal away when he is soon heard from in some direction by a fire being discovered. As his fires have thus far been kindled in the day-time they have always been discovered before much damage had been done. He is a regular little incorrigible, and it is hard to know what to do with him. Those living in his neighborhood are making efforts to have him sent to the San Francisco Industrial School.

**A NEPARIOUS TRANSACTION.**—A Mr. Sampson, of Bear River City, recently entrusted a person named T. F. West with a span of mules and wagon to bring him from Bear River to Echo City. Upon arriving in the neighborhood of Echo city, on Friday, 11th West sold the mules and wagon for \$175 and pocketed the proceeds. The circumstance leaked out, and Mr. S. B. Reed telegraphed an account of it to the police here on the evening of Sunday last. On Thursday morning Mr. Sampson arrived in this city and getting some information of the windier's whereabouts, he accompanied by one of the police, started in pursuit, and overtook him about three miles south of Bountiful city, and arrested him and brought him to this city to be dealt with.

This morning West was discovered in his cell in the city prison, apparently in a dying condition, with an empty three ounce vial by his side, which it is supposed had contained morphine. Medical assistance was promptly obtained and all that science could do to neutralize the poison was done but his recovery is doubtful.

**A CORRECTION.**—The San Francisco Times, a paper which is usually very careful and correct, in an article on the "Progress of the Central Pacific Railroad," seems to be completely at sea in relation to the topography of this country.

It says: "During the fall it seemed almost certain that the Union Pacific Railroad Company would reach Salt Lake before the Central Pacific Company. But a light winter and freedom from snow along the line of the latter road, have greatly favored progress on this side, while heavy snow-storms in the Rocky Mountains have put a stop to track-laying on the Atlantic end of the great iron highway. The Central Pacific Company have ready all the timber and stone requisite (for bridging, ties, culverts, etc.) to carry their line to the Wasatch Mountains, and the energy displayed in the late shipments via the Isthmus has nearly doubled the locomotive power on the road, and supplied in connection with shipments via Cape Horn, the requisite iron for track-laying all winter. Even should the present fine weather change, the Central Company is fully prepared to remove any and all obstructions immediately, though in any event, few obstructions can be encountered on the line, where necessary, being housed in thoroughly. These facts fully justify the conclusion that the Central Pacific Company will have their line completed to the foot of the lofty Wasatch Mountains, 158 miles east of Salt Lake, by the time that the Union Company has accomplished the herculean task of crossing that range at an elevation of over 7,000 feet.

Salt Lake City itself stands at the foot of the lofty Wasatch mountains, and the Union Pacific Company have their track laid to within sixty-five miles of the mouth of Weber Canyon, which is also at the foot of the Wasatch mountains, though thirty miles north of Salt Lake City. The Central Pacific Company is probably not less than 250 miles distant from that point, though we cannot state accurately how far distant it is.

**Big Snow Storm.**—Yesterday afternoon, the storm, which had been threatening for some hours, broke forth, and for several hours the snow descended in a style that could not very well be better, continuing until it was about six or eight inches deep. The atmosphere was cleared, and the stars shone out with their usual brilliancy. This is the only storm we have had thus far worthy of note this season.


